Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope you enjoyed the Thanksgiving holiday and were able to spend quality time with family and friends. Thanksgiving is truly a time to reflect on all of the blessings in our lives. As a school and community, we have much to be grateful for. I would like to thank you for your support and participation at our recent Student-Led Conferences. Our students did a wonderful job exhibiting and highlighting their work in the classrooms. The children I spoke with were very proud of their efforts and most appreciative of those who were able to attend.

This past week, our music department had their first Winter performance. Our choir students have spent the last several weeks rehearsing for this performance, and it was incredible. We have two upcoming performances at East Lyme High School: December 6th our band will perform, and our orchestra will be playing on December 12th. We look forward to seeing you at these performances.

Though the Holidays evoke feelings of joy and happiness, they can also add levels of increased stress. The following resource is provided by our counseling office, and is a support available not only during December, but throughout the year.

The Child & Family Agency in New London now offers urgent mental health services through their Urgent Crisis Center. CFA's Urgent Crisis Center (UCC) provides walk-in (no appointment necessary) care to children and teens experiencing an urgent mental health or behavioral crisis, including:

Thoughts of suicide or self-injury
Feelings of depression, anxiety, or hopelessness
Out-of-control behaviors
Substance misuse
Any mental health crisis

This is a voluntary program that requires parent/guardian consent, presence, and participation. UCC offers crisis stabilization support, mental health assessments, collaborative safety planning, and connects you with ongoing mental health services/counseling in under 24 hours. This is a great option for students who are experiencing a mental health crisis and are having difficulty finding a counselor, as waitlists at many providers are generally long. Although appointments are not necessary, it is helpful to call ahead when possible. They are open Monday-Friday, 8 AM to 10 PM, and Saturday, 10:00 AM – 10:00 PM, for kids 18 and younger. UCC is located at 255 Hempstead St, New London. The phone number is (860) 437-4550. UCC accepts most insurance plans.

Our students really enjoy learning about celebrations in other countries, and they also love to share their own family traditions!

Our fifth graders have been exploring the French language this past trimester, learning greetings, numbers, the alphabet, days, months, seasons, and weather. In late January we will switch over to Spanish for the remainder of the year.

Both sixth grade French and Spanish students are currently practicing numbers and telling time. Soon they will start learning verbs so that they can talk about what they enjoy doing in their free time. This always opens up many fun opportunities to express themselves in a new language; a very rewarding experience.

Seventh graders have been wrapping up their unit of study on school life in French and Spanish speaking countries. They always find it amazing to see what their peers in other countries are doing in school. Soon, they will review and conjugate verbs to communicate what they and others do in their leisure time.

Eighth grade students have been learning vocabulary of family members and how to describe what they are like. This is quite involved as it requires them to use adjective agreement and differentiate the types of verbs they choose. Coming up is a unit on "getting around town", a useful toolbox of vocabulary with real-life applications!
