What are CP and DP?

CP (Career-related Programme) is a program, here at Edgewood, that helps students explore the career path they're interested in. Whether it's IT, dance, art, or film, students are given the aid they need in developing the path of their choice. In CP, students take a mixture of both IB and non-IB classes in order to develop these skills. Through the extra class they take (career prep) students learn how to apply their skills in the real world, preparing them for future career opportunities. In DP (Diploma Programme), students take college-level classes to help prepare them for academic life after high school be it college or trade school. Through these rigorous classes, students gain a better understanding of each of their subjects (be it history, biology, or math) and work to develop skills they will use later on in life. Through their extra class TOK (theory of knowledge), they learn how to combine all the skills they have learned in their IB-level classes and use them to question the sources and implications of knowledge. Overall, both CP and DP offer helpful skills that students can use after high school and in the real world. - Rubi Torres
