Please see below. We are entitled under state statute (I have reviewed it with an attorney) to receive information with respect to hiring of any position (from the superintendent on down) on the three top candidates reviewed for that position. We are allowed upon request to review before any meeting upon which a recommendation is to be considered by the board.

And, we are not required to ask for said information of all applicants for any position as a matter of custom. In that regard, we may individualize our requests to specific actions as we may choose.

I did not receive any information requested of you for either the CFO or the Chief/COO position prior to the last board meeting.

I did receive a statement from you reviewing customary actions from the previous board. (By-the-way, I was never told by the previous board nor was there any statement of policy given which justifies the contention that an individual board member cannot ask for information in writing even though the superintendent considers those actions and questions beyond the limits of custom.)

Further, the superintendent as provided in the Cunningham vs. Anderson County court case has no right to arbitrarily decide which board member's questions he or she wishes to answer nor does he or she have the right to pick and choose which questions she wishes to avoid or which public documents he or she wishes to conceal.

Since you might have other qualified candidates from the first set of interviews and more importantly, since the position has been re-advertised, I reiterate my first request: "Please provide to the full board the logs of all interviews and notes* made for all candidate interviews with respect to these positions."* I am informed by the attorney that we may not have the right to see interview notes since they might necessarily provide privy information.

However, we are most certainly allowed to review interview logs, resumes, applications and any other information required for consideration of the candidate or submitted by the applicant as a part of the application.

I reiterate my request for this information above well in advance of the upcoming board meeting in which candidates for the CFO position are to be considered.

Board Members and Dr. Melton,

I was excited to see D5 publish COVID-related data for the district. I teach our Master's of Accounting students data visualization here at USC, and I know that having

access to data isn't always beneficial. Data can only be beneficial when the context is clear for people and they can make relative comparisons. I have collected the last two publications of the D5 data and have taken some time to visualize the data in a way

that may provide more meaning to you as board members and to the general public. Admittedly, my analyses are rather limited at this time because I lack sufficient data to make better visualizations. For example, I have submitted a FOIA request to identify

staffing levels at each school, because it's hard to interpret five staff positive cases without knowing if there are 20 or 200 staff at a location. I am still waiting on that data. I was, however, able to identify how many students are at each school, which

has allowed me to start calculating certain base rates and putting the positive and quarantine data into perspective. The other limiting factor is time. Understanding trend data is very difficult with only two datapoints in time. I can do trend analyses, but

I will have to wait until more weekly data has been published.

Currently, I have published four visualizations that might be useful to you in your understanding of the data. The visualizations can be found here:

The first tab represents a base line expectation of positive student cases based on the percentage of district students represented by a school. For example, if a

school has 10% of the district's total students, we would expect they would have about 10% of the district's total student positive cases. That reference line is represented as the diagonal dashed y=x line. Any school whose indictor is below that line has

fewer students who have tested positive compared to what would be expected by their school's population size. Any school who is above the line is experiencing more positive student cases than what would be expected for their size. This should allow you to

identify which schools are more problematic than others. I will do a similar analysis for staff once I get access to the data.

The second visualization looks at percentages of students who are quarantined compared to percentage of students who are positive. This helps understand student spread

to some extent (though staff positives can have a far more reaching impact on quarantine rates). This allows you to better understand how exponential the quarantine procedures are. For example, one of the most aggregious is Chapin Middle, who has 0.41% of

their student body positive, but have quarantined 12% of their student body. I have included two reference lines. First, a 10% threshold line because that is what the Board has decided as a potential reaction point. Second, a trend line that allows you to

see the expected quarantine rate.

The third visualization articulates the quarantine effect in a different way. For this chart, I quantified how many students are quarantined for each positive student.

Right now, LMES is quarantining 35 students per a single case of COVID. Now, given that my kids go to

LMES, I know that this is an artificial number that is skewed by an instructional staff who had interactions with multiple classes and therefore caused the

quarantining of those classes. Over time, though, this data will equalize and we'll get a better picture of the effects of each positive case.

The final visualization is merely a reference point that I will track over time to allow people to understand how D5 is doing compared to the general public. Honestly,

we're doing great. The national base rate of infection has been 2.8% and 2.7% over the last two dates that data have been published for D5. Our overall student base rate (I can't incorporate staff numbers yet because I don't know the staff denominator) has

been 0.28% and 0.40%, respectively. Data like these indicate that our students represent a lower infection risk than the general public.

As I have more time to develop more analyses, I will update the dashboard. Additionally, as I get access to the staff data, I will be able to incorporate a couple more analyses as well.

I will say this — longitudinal and base rate data is critically important for the public to make an informed decision based on the data we are publishing. Without

it, they will have no idea what the trends are or the efficacy of our protocols. People dealing with COVID fall victim to confirmation bias all the time. Data without context will only confirm one's prior expectations.

As always, I am willing to talk about this with any of you. Also, if you have specific requests for a visualization, please let me know and I will create it for you.



Dr. Stefaniak, I can't tell you how impressed and appreciative I am of your work. As a finance person, I was adamant that we get the data and you have done far more with it than I could have imagined. I am curious what you would advise given your analysis. For example, we recently passed a "10% rule" that allows the superintendent to move a school to hybrid or all virtual if the combined student or staff positive rate plus quarantined rate exceeds 10%. Frankly, the "rule" was based on another school district and there was no discussion on whether or not 10% was the right threshold or this was even the correct measure. I think we were trying to find a simple objective measure that could be applied at an individual school level vs. the then current district-wide decisions.

I would like to see your work more widely published and discussed. That may take some time or not be feasible for the district to do so. As such, you may want to check out some community facebook pages that may be interested in hosting a link to your work.

I appreciate the feedback. I believe there are a couple components to making decisions about going hybrid. I'll try to unwrap each one individually.

Quarantine procedure efficacy — Right now, we are contact tracing students and quarantining a large portion of our student base because of the protocols we're following.

As you saw, right now we are quarantining about 17 kids across K-12 in-person classes per positive student case. That actually is lower than I would have expected. However, what we don't know right now is whether those quarantine procedures are really stopping

case spread and to what extent. Luckily, under the new CDC guidelines, students can return to school sooner as long as they provide a negative COVID test at least five days after exposure. This will be great data to analyze and I encourage you to ask for this

data from nurse Stanek. For instance, what we'll be able to tell is what percentage of students quarantined actually contracted the virus. If the number is something like 1% of quarantined kids turned out to test positive for COVID, then we need to take a

hard look at whether the cost of sending kids home again (not only on their educations, but also on the economic stability of the household) is worth it. Alternatively, if 20% of our quarantined students are reporting back that they have tested positive, we

can take a little more comfort in the notion that the quarantine protocols are effective. As I've stated in a previous email to the Board, we do not take a similar approach to the flu, yet the flu is more deadly towards school-aged children than COVID. Specifically,

the flu during the 2018-2019 season killed 211 kids aged 5 to 17 (https://www.cdc.gov/flu/about/burden/2018- <u>2019.html</u>). In the 2019-202 flu season 180 5-17 year old kids died from the flu (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/flu/</u>

about/burden/2019-2020.html).

COVID, on the other hand, has killed 153 kids aged 5 to 17 (https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-datatracker/#demographics). There needs to be judgment consistency between our approach to COVID and our approach to other illnesses. Specifically, will we start sending entire classes home if one kid tests positive for the flu in coming years? And yes, you can catch the flu from someone one day before they show symptoms (https://www.cdc.gov/flu/about/disease/spread.htm).

Internal consistency in judgments is key in situations like there. Hypocrisy will lose a large portion of your audience very quickly. In any case, I would be interested in learning more about quarantine efficacy by examining the data we'll have from students

trying to get out of quarantine early with a negative COVID test.

The 10% rule - Arbitrary thresholds are incredibly challenging to fight logically. Again, let's return to judgment consistency. In the past, when there has been a

really bad flu going around, at what point have schools shut down? Anecdotally, I can remember a handful of years ago, my daughter's class only had a couple kids in it one day because there were so many sick kids. A quick search indicates that most schools

cancel due to a flu outbreak at about 20% of the student body (https://www.wpri.com/news/local-news/south-<u>county/block-island-cancels-school-friday-amid-flu-outbreak/</u>,

https://news.yahoo.com/school-close-2-days-flu-000423910.html). In South Carolina specifically, in 2019 schools were still operating with more than 10% of their students absent from the flu (https://www.greenvilleonline.com/story/news/local/south-carolina/2019/02/08/which-schools-have-flu-andincreased-absences/2804850002).

Maybe there's a state law about mandated quorums that could be looked into. I think more than agreeing to the 10% rule and having the burden of proof to try to say why that is an unreliable figure, someone should have to articulate why that number was chosen.

Switch the burden of proof. Right now, you could say that all of LMES should be shut down because their last numbers were at 12% quarantined (students). However, that was all caused by one instructional aid who tested positive, but had exposure to several

different classes. It wasn't the kids' fault who were quarantined. To shut a school down based on an arbitrary number and an overly conservative quarantine protocol is egregious in my mind. Parents who are worried about COVID have other options. Many who want

F2F do so because they need F2F in order to survive. Let me put this into perspective. The average student positive case results in 17 quarantined students (as mentioned above). The average D5 school has 800 kids in it. That means for every positive student

case, we are quarantining on average about 2.125% of the student body. That means that something like 5 cases in a school of 800 could shut it down. That would mean that an infection rate of 0.6% could shut a school down. The national base infection rate is

over 2.5%. The 10% threshold seems like it will almost certainly be eclipsed for every school at some point. It sure seems like some sound judgment should be used rather than a bright line threshold. Like, if a school passes 10%, the Board ought to discuss

with Melton the underlying causes for the quarantine and whether this was anomalous (e.g., an instructional aid contacting several classrooms) or something that indicates rampant actual spread in the school.

Bluntly, I believe my analyses suggest that the quarantine protocols are insane and unsustainable. I don't think the district has much say in how they quarantine

(because of DHEC and the CDC), but they certainly have say in how they react to the data. People need to understand just how few people are contracting the virus. Chapin and DF High are both over 10% quarantine rate, but less than 1% of their students are

positive. So, what we're saying is that we're going to send the whole school home because less than 1% of the students are sick? I don't understand this logic. Shools were operating when more than 10% of their schools were confirmed sick with the flu, not just could be sick with the flu. That perspective matters. What's crazier is that we don't even know if the students are catching it at school. There is research that suggests teaching modality doesn't even influence

infection rates, indicating most students and staff are catching COVID outside of school (https://threadreaderapp.com/thread/1309476096598040577.html).

I'll stop ranting now as this email is far longer than it needed to be. As I said, I will help in any way I can. I'm not on social media anymore but am not opposed

at all to the visualizations I made getting out there (that's why I made them public). I'll see if I can get my wife or someone to post it.

Data are unemotional, and I think we need a little less emotion in this environment.

Board Members,

I recently had a phone call with Katrina Goggins and Van Holden about the D5 COVID dashboard. During the conversation they both shared that they will not make modifications to the dashboard without Board approval. I wanted to share this with you in case you thought they were working to

improve any aspect of the dashboard. I'm not saying this in a derogatory manner towards Katrina or Van, just as a procedural heads-up. They believe

you are the ultimate authority in regards to the dashboard and its contents rests on the Board. Without being too presumptuous, I would like to put a couple recommendations out there about the dashboard for you to consider:

1.

Percentages. The Board has established 10% quarantine (of either students or staff) as a threshold to evaluate in-person learning.

While there are other factors that could also make a school go virtual, the public could most easily understand this 10% threshold and watch for concerning trends. I would suggest the dashboard be updated with the percentages that the raw numbers represent,

so parents can more easily track how close they are to a possible virtual move (e.g., LMES 5 cases (0.5% of student body)). My guess is that this will take a decision about what the denominator will be (something static like a Day 10 enrollment figure might

be most useful). Whatever the case, percentages can help parents out substantially as that seems to be the decision criteria.

2.

Update frequency. Update frequency came up in our discussion as a result of their speaking to the reliability of the data.

For instance, there is some movement in the data (i.e., errors) that need to be cleaned out before the District is releasing the information to the public. I can see this notion, as wanting to be accurate is a noble character trait. The other side of the coin

is decision usefulness and timeliness. The District (Melton) is making a decision on a daily basis using data collected from the different schools. There are likely errors in this data, but Melton is using the data to the best of her ability to make an informed

judgment. The dashboard is linked to a dataset that is easily updated at the push of a button (Katrina will confirm this). The Board should consider whether a weekly update (more accurate) is what they want or if they want data to be more in lockstep with

Dr. Melton's dataset (timelier and facilitates better trend analysis). If the latter is considered, a note should be added to the data (much like CDC data about COVID within the last two weeks) that the data is not finalized and likely contains errors. As

an aside, as the conversation progressed on this topic, I was told the reason the dashboard is updated only weekly is because that was what the Board asked for. However, I recall the Board being told that the data upkeep would be resource intensive and the

Board making the concession of weekly. If updating the dashboard is easy and the data Melton is using is already being collected, the incremental cost to put it on the dashboard is insignificant. You may want to get clarification on this. Just something to

think about.

One other note: The Board might want to consider an updated survey about parent and teacher preferences. I know you all get a lot of emails, and it seems prudent

to get a bigger picture of what's going on rather than which parent/teacher group is deciding to ramp up its voice from week-to-week. I believe the last time parents were surveyed was September, but I could be wrong. I also am not sure when teachers were surveyed

last about their preferences. I understand that the feedback might not be actionable (e.g., 90% of teachers say they want to teach only virtually), but it would give the Board a better understanding of what the status of the community is. A lot has changed since September.

I continue to update the dashboards I am creating, including a new mapped version of the District and the ability to filter by dates. If you are interested, the dashboard is still available here:

Below are initial responses to the questions raised by the Board. While much of this is still incomplete, the below may be helpful as we move toward Monday nights Board Meeting. Thanks!

Hi Dr. Harris,

Please see our assumptions below as well as our responses to Mrs. Huddle's questions highlighted in red below. The virtual platform update is provided under item #4.

We would like to clarify the assumptions that are incorporated into Scenarios 5 and 6, including the maps and projection tables:

- No impacts to intermediate, middle, and high school students
- Only impacts current CES or LMES students who live within redistricted areas. Students who attend other elementary schools or special programs would not be impacted under Scenarios 5 and 6.
- No changes to current open choice or magnet students and programs
- · No changes to current special education students and programs
- Students impacted by the enrollment freeze are assumed to stay in current buildings and pathways
- No changes to current Pre-K enrollment levels or program placement
 - Assumes 40 additional Pre-K students at Piney Woods

#1 - I would like to see a chart such as the one attached for each scenario for the 3 impacted schools and would like to see greater detail for each school, including:

For each school separately (PWES, CES and LMES):

We will provide 10-year projections for PWES, CES, and LMES in the presentation. These account for all of the assumptions noted above.

- * Current and projected attendance by grade without school choice (ie., school choice is not offered at PWES and only children currently enrolled in choice at CES and LMES are included)
- * Current and projected attendance in other programs (such as PK4, speech therapy, etc).

We recognize that there are numerous programs and populations that are based on unique needs and therefore fall outside of "what can be projected". We do not project enrollment separately for special programs such as Speech Therapy, Special Education, Open Choice, or Magnet programs due to their small sample size and concerns over student privacy. However, these students are accounted for in our methodology as noted in our assumptions above.

* The number of students the school is constructed to hold

We are using an enrollment target of 630 students at PWES, which is 90% of the building's capacity of 700 students. When opening a new school, we recommend leaving ample buffer space to account for future housing development, student growth, and programmatic changes.

* The number of students the school is configured to hold based on current programs or other limitations.

District staff to provide update on planned PWES programs

#2 - I would like to see the maps the presented the board with the # of current students in each planning block (the maps presented at the workshop - screenshot attached).

We will provide maps that show redistricted areas under Scenarios 5 and 6 as well as the number of students who would be impacted. This excludes any students who are enrolled in choice programs,

magnet programs, or are impacted by the enrollment freeze as discussed in our assumptions above. The planning blocks do not align exactly with Scenarios 5 and 6. They merely serve as a starting point for the Board Workshop and have since been refined as we develop our scenarios.

#3 - I have a feeling that most discussion will center on the moving lines from LMES to CES so I would like to know exactly how many students would be impacted by grade level and that those numbers not include any additional school choice (would only include impacted students currently enrolled in choice).

We will provide a breakdown of impacted students by grade level. Our projections assume a continuation of current open choice, magnet, and other special programs as noted above. These students were not reassigned under any of the Scenarios

#4 - A summary of the feedback received from parents/the communicty on the proposed scenarios.

Since our update on Friday, we have had 366 page views on the virtual platform. We will provide a further update for the packet tomorrow and again on Monday.

Dear Dr. Melton and Board of Trustees,

As a retired teacher and substitute with 42 years of experience in Lexington Richland School District Five, I'm writing this letter to bring to your attention a couple of issues substitute teachers in our district face. Correcting these concerns will help eliminate the shortage of qualified substitutes needed to fill the faculty and staff absences that are currently an issue in our schools,

First, and most obvious to every substitute, is the rate of pay. For the past 14 years, Lexington Richland

Five has paid certified substitutes only \$75.00 per day and \$65.00 for non-certified personal. This is

substantially lower than neighboring school districts that have increased the daily rate of pay to a minimum of \$125.00.

District Five needs to address this discrepancy as soon as possible to ensure we retain not only the most qualified but also an ample number of substitutes necessary to meet the growing need.

Secondly, teachers who agree to accept a long-term substitute position should be paid their normal daily rate of pay starting on day one of the contract. Lexington Richland Five currently does not start paying a long term sub their daily rate of pay until day 11. As you know, the first 10 days are the hardest and most challenging for a sub as they attempt to establish a smooth transition between students, parents, and staff while in an unfamiliar environment. It is important these experienced, certified substitutes are compensated appropriately for accepting the responsibilities and duties associated with teaching our students.

Finally, in the current Covid environment it is even more important than ever to ensure every person entering our schools and working with our children is a dedicated, responsible, and qualified individual. In order to recruit the best available, we must make the job as attractive as possible. Fair, competitive compensation is the surest way to achieve this.

Hello Dr. Melton,

Here are the responses to the questions related to the extension of the covid-related leave. I hope this helps, but let me know if I missed anything.

- I have seen other school districts extend to a specific date with the most common being 3/31 and 6/30. Are you requesting a specific date?
 - o The pending motion would allow District Five to provide emergency paid sick leave for up to two weeks, as initially outlined by the Employee Paid Sick Leave Act (EPSLA), beginning January 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2021 (end of fiscal year and end of the school year).
- Would the policy be retroactive to 1/1/21?
 - Yes
- I have also seen most districts extend the same policy as 2020 but have also seen some change it. Are you proposing the same policy/rules for 2021 as were in place for 2020?
 - The district's current proposal is more conservative than the 2020 requirements under The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) that applied from April 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020.
 - Under the expired FFCRA, there were two rules for the administration of paid leave. The first rule was the Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act (EPSLA), which required that employers provide
 - up to 80 hours/2 weeks of paid sick leave to employees who needed to take leave for specific reasons related to COVID-19. The second rule was the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act (EFMLEA), which required that employers expand FMLA to provide up to 12 weeks of emergency leave to eligible employees if the employee is caring for his or her son or daughter whose school or place of care was closed or whose child care provider was unavailable for reasons related to COVID-19.
 - The district's current proposal would maintain up to 80 hours/2 weeks of leave on an asneeded basis and based on the same specified COVID-related reasons outlined under the EPSLA; however, it would not extend the additional 12 weeks of emergency leave to employees that were available under EFMLEA.
 - o The current proposal would also only apply to eligible employees who have not already exhausted two weeks of emergency paid leave before December 31.
 - o Qualifying Reasons for Leave Under the FFCRA, an employee qualifies for paid sick time if the employee is unable to work (or unable to telework) due to a need for leave because the employee: (1) is subject to a Federal, State, or local guarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19; (2) has been advised by a health care provider to self-quarantine related to COVID-19; or (3) is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and is seeking a medical diagnosis.
- It sounds like there isn't (currently) any \$ for this and that while we have received ESSR and other funds we would still receive those funds whether or not we extended Covid leave - is that accurate?

 While the district's receipt of ESSR funds is not contingent on a decision to extend COVIDrelated leave; the memo (linked here) released by Superintendent Spearman states, "the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) strongly recommends each district create an emergency leave plan using their ESSER funds to ensure those who need to take paid leave for a

COVID-19 related issue may do so." The memorandum also states that "there is adequate federal funding from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act's Elementary

and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund to cover leave for school district employees in 2021."

 This proposal would allow the district to be consistent with what the state has asked us to do and provide a level of support to employees based strictly on the EPSLA criteria.



Board Members,

Below are responses to questions regarding FIVE for the 2021-22 school year. I regret the formatting of this information, we were prepared to discuss this tonight during the policy conversations that focused upon this content. The staff listed responses in bullet form. Context can be provided this evening should there be interest.

- * FIVE would be available to all students in School District 5 as a program of choice option.
- * Anticipated student fees would be the same for students in FIVE as students in-person.
- * The minimum number of students will vary depending upon level, as factors such as grade level configuration and scheduling vary across levels. Every attempt will be made to ensure student to teacher ratios ranging from 12:1 to 25:1 as outlined in Administrative Rule IIB-R: Class Size. The minimum and maximum number of students will be adhered to in FIVE as outlined in the referenced administrative rule.
- * G Suite Enterprise for Education (Google Enterprise) will continue to be the uniform district wide delivery system.
- * Mobile Hotspots will not be offered to families in FIVE as it is a program of choice versus a program during a pandemic.
- * Students and staff in FIVE are given the same hardware as in-person students and staff.
- * The projected costs for licensing and programs exclusive to FIVE is \$60,000 based upon current rates and based upon current approved requests.
- * There are no projected consulting costs exclusive to FIVE.
- * FIVE courses for elementary school will be the core content areas, in addition to electives such as Physical Education, Art, Music, and World Language.
- * FIVE courses for intermediate and middle school will be the core content areas, in addition to electives such as Physical Education, World Language, various Visual and Performing Arts, and computer courses.
- * FIVE courses for high school will be College Preparatory and Honors courses in core content areas, in addition to electives such as Physical Education, World Language, some CATE, and various Visual and Performing Arts. Advanced Placement (AP) classes will be based upon student interest levels, but there will be fewer AP offerings in FIVE than in-person. Parents and students will be able to view the entire FIVE Course Catalog prior to selecting FIVE as a program of choice.
- * In accordance with Board Policy GCK: Professional Staff Assignments and Transfers and Administrative Rule GCK-R: Professional Staff Assignments and Transfers, every attempt will be made to reassign existing personnel to staff FIVE. Also, in accordance with Board Policy GBC: Staff Compensation, compensation for professional staff would be based upon district and state salary schedules.
- * As of January 20th, we have 4558 students in FIVE. If 4558 students left FIVE to go to another online program, the District would lose approximately \$8.6 million (based upon the current State of South Carolina Base Student Cost of \$1,888.44).

Mrs. Hammond,

I am writing in reference to Mr. Loveless' request that he assume the role of inspecting and critiquing Piney Woods Elementary School with Nicki Gardner on behalf of the District.

If you recall, Mr. Loveless obtained a contract through his personal company to do work with Contract Construction sometime in the early part of 2020. Mr. Loveless never disclosed this financial relationship to the Board but was questioned about it in the Board's September 14, 2020 meeting at which time Mrs. Hutchinson raised the question of whether that financial relationship created an ethical problem. On September 25, 2020 Mr. Loveless obtained an Ethics Opinion (the "Opinion") from the South Carolina Ethics Commission based on Mr. Loveless bidding on second project with Contract Construction. The Opinion is addressed directly to Mr. Loveless and he put a copy of the letter on the minutes of our September 25, 2020 Board meeting...

While the Opinion concludes there is no outright prohibition for Mr. Loveless' company to enter into a contract with Contract Construction (while it is a vendor to the District), the Opinion is also very clear that Mr. Loveless, as a Board member, is required to recuse himself pursuant to Section 8-13-700(B) of the SC Code of Laws (the "Code") from any matters the District has with Contract Construction.

As cited in the Opinion, Section 8-13-700(B) of the Code clearly states that no public official may make, participate in making, "or in any way attempt to use his office to influence a governmental decision" involving the matter with which he has a financial relationship. Simply stated, Section 8-13-700(B) requires that Mr. Loveless recuse himself from any conversations or communication with the Board or the District involving Contract Construction and the Piney Woods School.

Section 8-13-700(B) of the Code also provides that (i) Mr. Loveless is required to prepare a written statement of his financial relationship with Contract Construction and deliver it to you (as the Board Chair) to put into the minutes of the Board, and (ii) that you, as the Board Chair are required to make sure that Mr. Loveless recuses himself from any discussions or votes pertaining to Contract Construction. I am not aware of any written statement Mr. Loveless submitted to put on the minutes of our Board meeting.

Technically, for Mr. Loveless to have properly complied with his recusal obligation he should have disclosed his financial relationship to the Board at the time his company first entered into the financial relationship with Contract Construction by submitting his written statement to the Board Chair and then he should have recused himself from all discussions or votes concerning the Piney Woods School. This means that if Mr. Loveless' company entered into its contract with Contract Construction prior to March 24, 2020 that Mr. Loveless should have never submitted his letter of March 24, 2020 to the Superintendent making allegations about the quality of the work of Contract Construction at the Piney Woods School site (which is a public document included on the minutes of the June 15, 2020 Board meeting) and he should have never participated in the discussions of the Piney Woods project in our September 14, 2020 Board meeting.

Even if Mr. Loveless was unaware of his ethical obligations at the time his company entered into its financial relationship with Contract Construction, he clearly should have known of his obligations after his receipt of the Opinion on September 25, 2020. This means that after September 25, 2020 Mr. Loveless should have immediately submitted his written statement of his company's financial relationship with Contract Construction to you as the Board Chair to put be into the minutes for public disclosure and he should have ceased any further efforts for him to personally be allowed to inspect and approve the construction of Piney Woods School. In other words, if Mr. Loveless company still has a financial relationship with Contract Construction then he is not in compliance with the Opinion (i)

if

he failed to submit his written disclosure to you to put into the Board minutes and (ii) because of his recent email requests to Dr. Melton and the Board that he and Nicki Gardner be given the actual plans to the Piney Woods school and the two of them be allowed to make trips to the school to inspect the construction.

I also shared the Opinion with my law partner, James Burns, who is an expert in the South Carolina Ethics laws and is a former past Chairman of the South Carolina Ethics Commission. After reviewing the Opinion, Mr. Burns' opinion is that Mr. Loveless is required to recuse himself from any discussions with the Board or District about the Piney Woods construction project and, you as the Board Chair, have an affirmative obligation to make sure he recuses himself.

I have attached a copy of the Opinion below.

My request is that you confirm whether Mr. Loveless has submitted his written disclosure about his company's financial relationship with Contract Construction. As Board members we are all entitled to know the start date and ending date of all contracts that Mr. Loveless' company has with Contract Construction. If Mr. Loveless has not prepared the written statement, then I would request you require him to do so prior to arriving at our meeting tonight and you publicly announce to the Board and the public (i) the starting and end dates of all financial relationships Mr. Loveless' company has with Contract Construction, (ii) that Mr. Loveless has to recuse himself from all communications or discussions the Piney Woods school, and (iii) you publicly notify him that he cannot supervise or inspect the construction. I am asking that you make these statements to in the public meeting to ensure transparency for the public, including the South Carolina Ethics Commission if it ever has to investigate whether Mr. Loveless is in compliance with his obligations in the Opinion.

I have other broader concerns about Mr. Loveless, or any Board member, attempting to personally supervise our construction projects based on the actual precedents established by Mr. Loveless with the Piney Woods School which I will detail in a separate email prior to our next meeting and to request we specifically evaluate the role of board members in construction review projects based on the actual experiences with the Piney Woods School.

As a reminder, please do not respond to this email. Our conversations on this topic need to be in our public meeting tonight.

School District Five school board approves redistricting plan for Piney Woods Elementary School

The Lexington-Richland School District Five Board of Trustees has approved a redistricting plan for Piney Woods Elementary School for the 2020-2021 school year.

The motion, which was approved by the board during its Jan. 25 meeting, approves "Scenario 5 for the 2021-2022 school year with two changes. The first change: 1. All properties along Old Lexington will be zoned to Chapin Elementary, and 2. PreK-4 will be deferred for consideration dependent upon the superintendent's recommendation."

The current plan that was approved would limit redistricting to elementary students in Chapin attendance zones so that attendance lines can be created for the new elementary school in Chapin. However, the board intends to revisit proposals for redistricting the entire district in the future, trustees said.

The final version of Scenario 5 will be posted online by January 29 and shared with staff and families.



At the bottom in white print "Superintendent's priority #5 is to promote a learning environment where students and staff feel safe physically, emotionally and socially. The safety of our students and staff is a top priority for School District Five, and it has been a top consideration during each phase of reentry."

So I beg to differ. But on Monday night you had a protest outside of this board meeting, Students who protested because they did not feel PHYSICALLY SAFE in your buildings. They are anxious and afraid and their emotional state is not in a good place right now. You had teachers telling you that they did not feel safe at their job. And you had students like me who decided to tell you face to face how terrified we were. And yet we are still going five days a week. And you really think that you have a right to say that our safety and mental health is a top priority. Today I had teachers stop me in the hallways all day to thank me for speaking to you because they are too afraid to. You are going to lose some of the most valuable teachers in the state because you want to make yourselves look good because our district is back to five days a week. Going back five days a week will not fix things. They will only make them worse. We are already dealing with covid in the schools and if you send us back full time it'll get infinitely worse. You have seen how happy we are in hybrid. And I am willing to stay four days a week because at least we have Wednesday to emotionally recharge and to have a day away from the exposure at the schools. If you send us back and a student dies because of covid, that will be on YOU. The blood will be on YOUR hands. That student's friends will never forgive you, their parents will never forgive you and neither will the teachers who taught that student. And trust me, if one of my friends dies because of your NEGLIGENCE, I will NEVER forgive you.

We will keep striking and protesting until you keep your word and make this safe PHYSICALLY AND EMOTIONALLY.

Chair Hammond,

I wanted to reach out to request items on the next meeting's agenda (and to explain my thoughts as to why I would like them included). Matt called me on Wednesday morning to ask me about my thoughts, but he didn't know when the officer's meeting would be scheduled. I am also not aware of any protocol as to how to request items, so I am sending this request to you and Dr. Melton.

First, I would respectfully request that our board meeting agendas be prepared with consideration as to the length of time each meeting requires. I do believe that the additional meetings added for this year should help alleviate this issue. I understand that board members may have agenda items that they would like to bring and believe they are important; however, I am just relaying that my opinion is that items brought forth by the Superintendent should always take priority and allow for proper discussion. Also, our first three meetings have lasted beyond 11:00, which requires district staff to work extremely long hours. I know this has not been intentional; we have many important issues beyond our control that we need to address.

Second, I would respectfully request that Mr. Scott Price from the SCSBA be present at the next board meeting to discuss policy and answer questions relating to best practices prior to the vote regarding board committees. As a new board member, I do not believe it is appropriate to vote on changing policy without counsel or training on best practices for school boards. New member training does not occur until March 4th. I am not opposed or disagree that we have board policies that need to be reviewed; I just want to ensure that the correct process is followed and that the language used is consistent with state law and best practices; and, that we are being transparent as to the need for such revisions/additions in policy.

Third, I would request that a discussion item relating to any potential conflicts of interests between Mr. Loveless and Contract Construction be added to the agenda, prior to the discussion item (voted on at the Monday meeting) regarding the Superintendent's expectations. I do not wish to perpetuate any conflict between board members and previous discussions. I am not asking for any additional explanation about discussions with a previous board. I am simply concerned by the SC Ethics Advisory Opinion put into the record by Mr. Loveless in September 2020. As I believe that the intent of the board committee policy is to create committees, such as a facility committee (although I am not sure the board has had a formal discussion on this), and, with the emails sent from Mr. Loveless to Dr. Melton requesting specific information on construction at PWES, I just want to ensure that we are protecting our Trustees and the District from any unwarranted or unwanted ethics violations. In no way am I accusing any Trustee of any wrongdoing; I believe the issue can be cleared up with a simple conversation and, perhaps, advice from counsel as to the specific requirements of recusal.

Speaking of which, at the last board meeting, it was mentioned by board officers that they had been provided with counsel from attorneys regarding district matters. As I am aware, board policy BDG does required (except in unusual circumstances) the board will make all communication to the school attorney through the superintendent or board chairman. I do believe that all communication provided by a school attorney should be provided to the entire board, at the same time, in the same manner. If a school attorney responds to a request from the board, through the board chair or superintendent, any response should be given in person or through written correspondence. This would alleviate any miscommunication or inadvertent discrepancies in legal advice.

I appreciate you taking the time to consider my requests (and apologize for the long email). I am not sure when board officers are meeting, but I would again renew the request that board officers meetings be open and recorded, as I know that all of our board members believe that transparency is important.

There is no need to reply; I have bcc'd all board members to this email.
