The community of Cotter Schools is blessed to have many families that have had multiple generations attend and remain connected to the school throughout their lives. For the Modjeski family, Cotter has not only been a school, but a legacy connecting the past, present, and future. The Modjeski family legacy began in 1954 when Gerald (Jerry) graduated after his years at St. Stan's and his wife, Anita, graduated in 1967. Faith, community, academics, and athletics were the foundation for a lifelong connection for the Modjeskis, as for many other Cotter families. The Modjeski family legacy spans multiple decades with over 20 family members having attended Cotter and some working for the school. The Modjeski family story includes students who were Salutatorians, AAA award winners, state-level athletes, choir and band recognitions, National Honor Society members, student council leaders, and athletes in basketball, football, soccer, and track and field.

Through the years, Cotter has shaped the character and supported the growth of the Modjeskis. Currently, Annie and Ashlee are seniors, graduating in 2024. Hugh is in first grade and will graduate in 2035, and two-year-old, Miriam, attends Educare and will graduate in 2039, 85 years after her grandfather.

Cotter Schools is grateful for the service provided by the Modjeski family. Fran '82 served on the board of directors for nine years and continues to support Cotter initiatives. Amy and Maggie have contributed many volunteer hours as well as donations to the Cotter Auction and athletic and community events. Amy has been working in the elementary level for eleven years, and Fallon '05 is in her seventh year teaching in early childhood.

The Modjeski family legacy stands as a testament to education, community and faith. Their family story is a great example of the importance of high quality, Catholic education at Cotter Schools and the strength of the Cotter community.
