Attendance Policy

Students should make every effort to be here on time every day.

Electronics & Toy Policy

STUDENT ELECTRONICS: Students may bring cell phones/smart watches to school provided they are **kept in the students backpack and turned off** throughout the duration of the school day. Students may use their cellphones **AFTER** school when actively contacting parents regarding dismissal plans. Electronics may NOT be used on the bus. If your child's phone goes off in class or they are caught with it on their persons this is the following progressive discipline protocol:

- . Verbal warning and student puts it away in backpack
- 2. Teacher will take it until the end of the day
- Phone will be brought to the office every morning and kept in a locked drawer until dismissal


Students are not allowed to bring toys or other personal items to school without prior approval or permission from the teacher. Grading Policy

The 5th grade teachers have been working hard to create learning for students. This learning will prepare students for 6th grade and offer a variety of ways for students to demonstrate what they have learned.

Rubrics will be used to track progress throughout writing units. These rubrics are aligned to standards and are designed to clearly communicate to students where they are in regards to our learning targets.

Students have goal sheets to communicate what is expected to achieve grade level proficiency in math and reading.



Feedback

Homework--<u>read each</u> <u>night</u>! We may assign reading sometimes, but mostly students will get to read books of their choice!

*If you would like additional resources for your child to have extra practice, reach out to your teacher!

We will provide feedback to students in a variety of ways:

- Asking students to join a small group
- Addressing misconceptions whole group
- Revising future tasks to meet student needs
- Individualized assignments based on student need

Pick up/Drop Off Arrival/Dismissal Times

Breakfast eaters can be dropped off at 9:15 am. All other students can be dropped off at 9:20 am. The tardy bell rings at 9:30 am.
