Florida Virtual School (FLVS) classes are counted as transfer credits and are not factored into the school GPA; we approve only in certain cases



Students may repeat classes for credit recovery on FLVS, but the original grade stays on the transcript. The new grade, marked by a TR (transfer credit), is not factored into the GPA

METHOD OF STUDENT ASSESSMENT



In 2019, we implemented a **formative/standards-based** method of teaching and assessment school-wide.



Final exams, participation, and homework grades were eliminated.



Grades are now based on the **mastery of standards**. Students are monitored and graded throughout the semester in the following three ways:

- **Formative Feedback**: The purpose of Formative Feedback is to provide information as to where the student is in the learning process on an ongoing basis. It is reported using a proficiency level scale that represents a student's progress toward mastering a standard. Formative work is designed for learning and is not included in a student's cumulative grade.
- **Performance Tasks (100%)**: Performance Tasks provide students the opportunity to demonstrate their mastery of course standards. Performance Tasks count toward a student's cumulative grade.
- Students may be **reassessed for mastery** if they have participated in tutorials and completed all their homework for that unit.

Students must be recommended by teachers or supported by test scores to take AP classes (with exceptions on a case-by-case basis)




All 9th, 10th, and 11th-grade students have the opportunity to take the College Board's NMSQT version of the PSAT
