

HOW DO I APPLY?

You can use the SUNY Application to apply to undergraduate programs at SUNY. Visit **suny.edu/apply** to create an account and get started. You may also apply using the Common App.

WHEN IS THE DEADLINE TO APPLY?

SUNY does not have a single application deadline. The earlier you apply, the better. We recommend checking the application deadlines at your chosen campuses to ensure a seat in your program of choice and for your best chance at the housing and scholarships you want.

WHEN WILL I BE NOTIFIED OF ADMISSIONS DECISIONS?

Decisions will be made for Early Decision applicants in December and Early Action applicants in January. Many campuses respond to regular decision first-year applicants on a rolling basis. Please check with the campuses you've applied to for specific information about the application process.
