Holiday Tips to Be Safe, Be Ready, and Be Kind:

SAFE: Holidays can include a lot of baking, cooking, and coziness. Encourage your child(ren) to be careful around the stove, fireplace, or any other very hot spot in the home. If they're older, always make sure they're monitored around any of those areas and know what to do in case they get hurt.

READY: With all the busyness around the holidays, accidents and unexpected things can happen. Remind them what to do in case of an emergency. For younger kids - teach them their address, phone number, and how to call 911. For older students - have a list of who to call if they need help, partner with your neighbors to make sure they can go somewhere safe if needed, and show them items they could use (fire extinguisher, flashlight, etc).

KIND: We all get the warm fuzzies during the holiday season. Encourage your child(ren) to make someone else's day and show kindness to others.

 be dropped off in the main lobby by December 8th.




Volunteer to help at Santa Shop! We need help gift wrapping and assisting the students with their shopping. If you are a PTA member on the approved volunteer list, please sign up!
