Montessori Philosophy



Maria Montessori was an Italian physician, educator, and innovator, acclaimed for her educational method that builds on the way children learn naturally.

Maria Montessori believed that children are not blank slates, but that they each have inherent, individual gifts. She emphasized independence, self-directed learning, and collaboration with peers. Children are encouraged to make their own decisions and teachers are considered facilitators in the classroom.

As soon as you enter a Montessori classroom, you know that something very different is afoot. You will see children working and learning independently and in small groups. You will notice specifically designed materials and manipulatives. You will notice children deeply engaged in their work and learning to respect themselves and their surroundings.

The Montessori Method fosters rigorous, self-motivated growth for children and adolescents in all areas of their development- cognitive, emotional, social, and physical.

What is CMP?

The California Montessori Project is a tuition-free public charter school network created in 2001 that is made up of seven campuses in the Greater Sacramento area:

Why a CMP Network?

- We hire own qualified staff (about 500 strong!)

What is a Charter School?

- CMP is an Independent Charter authorized by four local school districts (San Juan, Sacramento City, Elk Grove, and Buckeye Union School District)
 - Charters alllow for alternate teaching methods. (Montessori Philosophy & Curriculum)
 - We are overseen by Governing Board comprised of parents and community members
 - Charters are funded directly by the state through tax dollars
 - Develops own budget
 - We are responsible for California State Common Core Standards

Educational Program and Montessori Philosophy

- Students learn through use of special manipulative Montessori materials
- Multi-age level classrooms
- Our curriculum is carefully aligned with the California Content Standards
- Students work at their own pace
- Students work independently and in small groups
- Students are empowered to manage their daily independent work
- Teachers continually assess and monitor student progress (formally and informally)



 - ☐ Child Must Turn 5 Between: September 2, 2023 June 2, 2024
- ☐ Minimum Age Eligibility for Kindergarten:
 - □ School Year: 2024-2025
 - ☐ Child Must Turn 5 By: September 1, 2024
- ☐ Minimum Age Eligibility for 1st Grade:
 - ☐ School Year: 2024-2025

Lottery Process

- ☐ Go to School Mint and create an account .https://cmp.schoolmint.net/
 ☐ If your child has at least 1 school year of previous Montessori experience, please have the
 ☐ Director/Principal complete the Montessori Verification Form (can be found under the Enrollment
 ☐ and Lottery tab on the cacmp.org website).
- ☐ All applications need to be submitted by Tuesday, March 5th
- The Lottery is held publicly via zoom. Families will receive a link and login information through School Mint prior to the day.
- ☐ TK/K Lottery will be Tuesday, March 19th.
- ☐ 1st-8th Grade Lottery will be on Tuesday, March 26th.
- Families will receive results of the lottery (pulled or wait listed) through the communication method they choose when setting up their School Mint account. (Highly recommend choosing both email and text.)
- ☐ Families are able to login to their School Mint account at any time to check the status of their child's waitlist spot.
- ☐ Families have 72 hours to accept or decline a placement.
- Once families have accepted a placement, they receive a message from School Mint to begin registration paperwork..


