Meets state standards

Overall Rating

The Gap Closing Component is a measure of the reduction in educational gaps for student subgroups.

95.4% of students graduated in 5 years

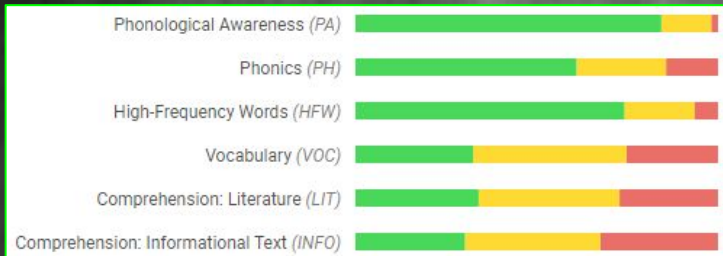
College, Career, Workforce and Military Readiness

This component looks at how well-prepared Ohio's students are for future opportunities, whether training in a technical field or preparing for work or college.

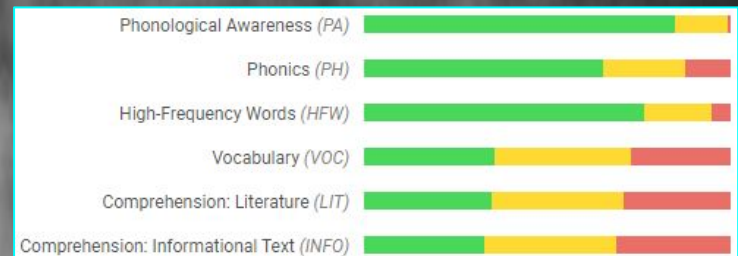
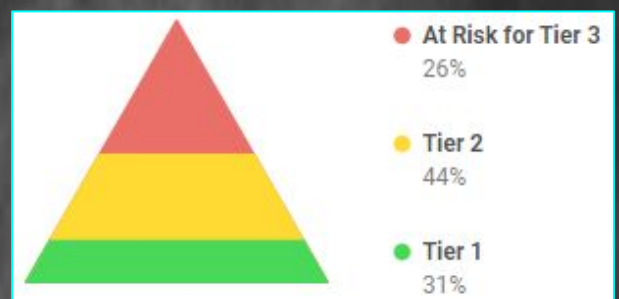

Reading - September 2022



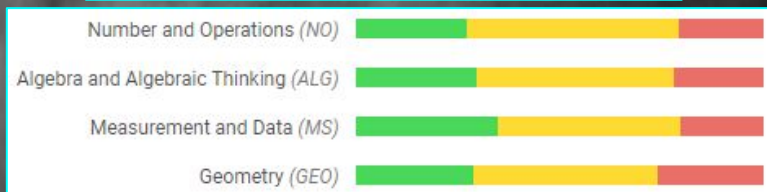
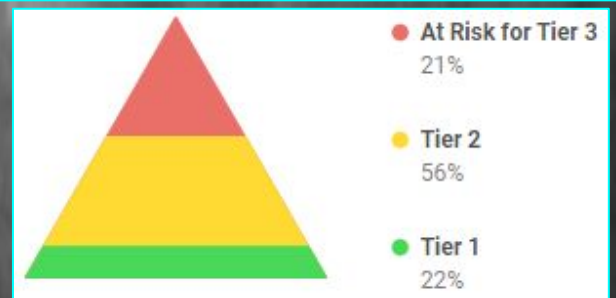
Reading - September 2023

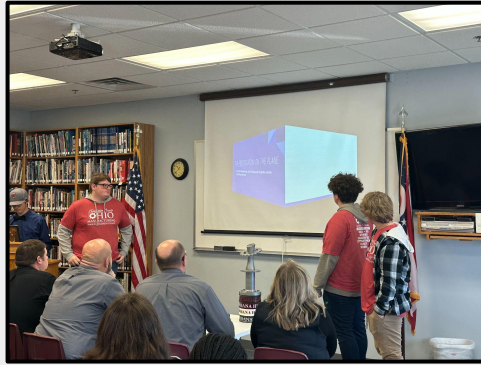

Our Kindergarten students learned from students in the Animal Science program at OHP, while our 4th grade students learned from students in the Construction Trades programs.



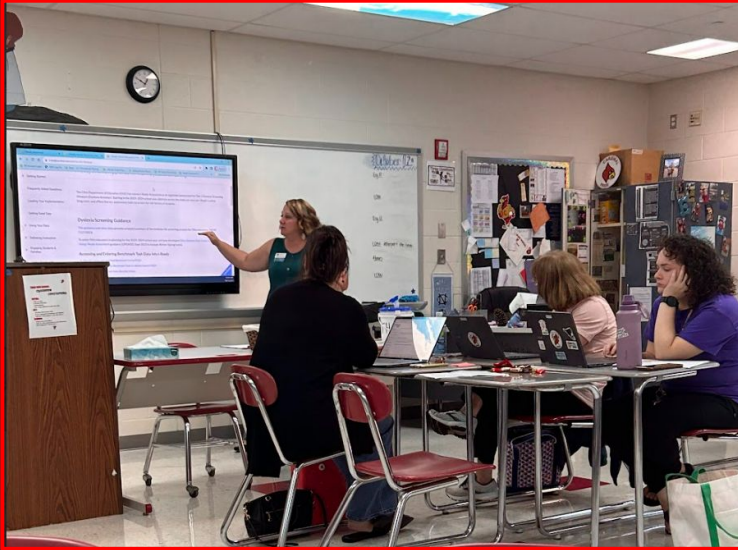
6th grade students were able to visit for a field trip to learn about Health Careers, Criminal Justice, Cosmetology and Graphic & Media Arts.
