Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

The district goals for 2023-2024 are:

By 2024, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of student scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestone to at least 80% in all content areas.

Mt. Zion Elementary School Goals

To increase mathematics and reading proficiency on the Georgia Milestones by 3% by 2024-2025, our school will focus on the following areas in grades 3 - 5:

School-wide Area of Emphasis

Multiplication and division facts within 100/Reading to learn instead of learning to read

Addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators

Development of equivalent fractions especially fractions with a numerator of 1

Addition and subtraction of fractions with unlike denominators

Encourage proficiency in all content areas

Connecting all subject areas through reading

Encourage authentic partnerships between educators, parents and students

Increasing reading comprehension

Development of equivalent fractions especially fractions with a numerator of 1

In our Classrooms

The 3rd-5th grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in math and reading. Some of our key connections with families will be to provide:

- families with multiplication and division math fact drills to practice at home.
- families with age-appropriate literature to ensure constant reading.
- families with access to math websites such as Khan Academy (www.khanacademy.com) and Learn Zillow (learnzillow.com)/tutor.com/ iReady to practice solving math problems and reading at home.
- families with practice constructed-response math and writing questions for use at home.
- families with short passages to encourage student reading comprehension
- families with monthly newsletters.
- families with resources targeting all content areas
- families with Parent Academic Workshops focusing on Math Skills and reading and afterschool assistance.

Mt. Zion Students

Mt. Zion Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and science. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Practice multiplication and division math fact drills at home in the monthly newsletter.
- Reading together with parents.
- Access websites for Khan Academy (www.khanacademy.com) and Learn Zillow (learnzillow.com) and tutor.com to practice solving math problems at home.
- Practice constructed-response math questions at home. Review monthly newsletters with parents and practice new math concepts at home.
- Use study guide at home to help me with homework and study for tests.
- Have parents check homework before completion.
- Access iReady at school and at home

At Home

Mt. Zion Elementary parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success by:

- Practicing multiplication and division facts with my child at home with my child.
- Reading with students at least 20 minutes a night
- Access websites for Khan Academy (www.khanacademy.com) and Learn Zillow (learnzillow.com) and tutor.com so my child can practice solving math problems at home and allowing/encouraging students to access iReady at home.
- Practice constructed-response questions at home with my child.
- Practice close reading technique with my students.
- Checking homework with students to ensure correction and completion
