Here are a few of our November highlights:

## McGlynn Playground Construction Update



In order to be ready in time for next September, the McGlynn Playground construction team determined that the ground breaking on the project needs to be moved up to this winter. Demolition of the current playground has been moved up to Monday, December 4th. A fence will be going up around the playground on December 1, and the playground will be closed to the public during construction.

While the playground is getting renovated, we encourage residents to visit other nearby parks, including Harris, Magoun, Logan, and the newly renovated Morrison playground and hope that you join us in being excited for our new playground to be completed earlier than anticipated!

### What to expect:

Work hours at the playground will be from about 7am to 3pm, Monday - Friday. Machinery will

not be used before 7am. MPS is working closely with the construction manager to minimize disruption to school pick up and drop off times.

Every effort is being made to support the school while the playground is unavailable; the construction team is prioritizing work that can be completed in cold weather. The first construction steps during cold weather include demolition, drainage, foundations, electrical, and digging rain gardens.

Principal O'Brien and the Playground Design Committee will be sending regular updates to the school community, and the Planning Dept. will have updates available on their parks projects site soon.

# 2024 Parking Permits Available Starting December 1



You can purchase your 2024 parking permits beginning December 1! There are several ways you can easily renew your permit:

- Online at <u>medford.gtechna.net/permit-</u> portal/
- In-person at the Parking Department at City Hall, Room 110.
- Or via kiosk located in the lobby of the Parking Department

This year when you apply to renew online, you will have the option to pick up your visitor passes by December 31 at the City Hall Parking Department or get your passes mailed to you for a \$1.10 mailing fee. Reminder that permits purchased for the 2024 season will not go into effect until January 1, 2024.

### Medford Seeks Applicants for Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board

The City is seeking applicants to serve on the Board of Trustees for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which is dedicated to supporting the preservation and creation of low- and moderateincome housing in Medford. Upon passage of the Affordable Housing Trust by the City Council last year, the new ordinance established a Board of Trustees tasked with oversight of the fund.

"The need for housing has only grown while the supply of affordable options has continued to dwindle, creating a crisis in our region," said Mayor Lungo-Koehn. "That's why I pushed for this Trust to be created and am thankful to have worked with the team in Planning, Development, and Sustainability and the City Council to get this approved."

Medford Public Schools Will Build City's First Universally Accessible Playground at the McGlynn School



In a landmark playground renovation, the City of Medford and Medford Public Schools will begin construction on a new, universally accessible schoolyard at the McGlynn School. Over the past 18 months, students, educators, parents, caregivers, and community members have come together to collaboratively design the park, which will be accessible and inclusive for all students and their families.

The playground renovation is set to begin in Spring, 2024. A representative design committee along with landscape architects from the Copley-Wolff Design Group crafted the plans to provide high "play value" for kids of all abilities,



Since many trees still have leaves that have yet to fall and be collected, the City has moved the second yard waste pickup date, originally scheduled for the week of the November 27, to the week of December 11.

### Medford Residents Have Recycled 602 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in November

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 602 pounds of unwanted clothing in November.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.

Fall "Big Sweep" Happening Through December 12 meaning that the playground will provide many types of play opportunities and a variety of developmentally-appropriate challenges, all with inclusion in mind. The park will include separate preschool and elementary play areas for students Pre-K to Grade 5, and features an inclusive wheelchair swing, multi-use field, a stage area, and a fully-accessible and curriculum-aligned outdoor classroom. The playground meets and goes beyond federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility standards to provide meaningful opportunities for students to play together.

The Medford DPW is conducting fall street sweeping over the course of several weeks, beginning on Monday, November 20 with Zone 6. In the interest of public health and public safety, the DPW will proceed with the fall Big Sweep over several weeks to clear leaves and debris from streets and catch basins, allowing for proper drainage of water and making sure that our City's streets are clean and safe. The DPW conducts two Big Sweep events on all secondary roads twice each year, once in the spring and once in the fall.

Street sweeping will be conducted Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8am and 6pm. Street sweeping is divided into 14 zones with one zone conducted each day. The full schedule and a list of all zones can be found at <u>www.medfordma.org/street-sweeping</u>. In the event of heavy rain or severe weather, sweeping may be cancelled on that day, and would be rescheduled for the end of the regular schedule.
