CURRICULUM

Courses are offered on a variety of levels at Millbrook High School: Advanced Placement (10), Honors, Regents, and School level.

Additionally, qualified juniors and seniors may choose to take advanced level courses at the high school and receive credit from Dutchess Community College, Marist College or Syracuse University.

Millbrook High School has implemented the Project Lead the Way pre-engineering curriculum in conjunction with Rochester Institute of Technology.

Full year courses are 40 minutes in length, 5 times per week, 40 weeks per year.

Half-year courses consist of 40-minute sessions for a total of twenty weeks per year.

GRADING AND RANKING

The passing mark is 65%. The final grade is based on 80% class work, 10% mid-term exam grade and 10% final exam grade. Rank and averages are based on six semesters, grades 9-11. In February of their senior year, students are re-ranked, taking into account grades from 1st semester. Final ranking is completed at the end of 12th grade. Rank in class is determined by weighted average. Grades on a transcript are not weighted. Weighting is used to calculate rank in class only.
