# WHAT IS THE RAFFLE?

The raffle is a school-wide fundraiser supporting the general operations at St. Pius X.

It is driven by the student-led Raffle Promotions Committee (RPC), which is supported by the Advancement Department.



# RAFFLE 101



- Houston, we have a Raffle kicks-off with a pep rally on Friday, January 26, in the auditorium. It will begin at 2:15 p.m. and the student raffle committee will be excused from class at approximately 1 p.m.
- Prior to the pep rally, packets for each student will be placed in the faculty lounge and sorted via advisory families. Advisors will distribute.
- Each packet will contain 32 tickets and five raffle collection envelopes. Tickets may be purchased online. Each ticket is \$10.
- Every student is asked to sell \$320 in raffle tickets to earn holidays and other incentives. \*Parents may opt-out their student from selling by making a tax-deductible contribution. No raffle entries will be given; the student is eligible for applicable holidays and drawings.
- Students are encouraged to sell more than the minimum. We offer three top seller prizes and early bird incentives.
- On Collection Days, students meet with their advisory family to turn in their tickets (this is ~15 minutes first thing in the morning).
- Students may sign-up for Phonathons and After Mass Parish Sales through Donna Cropper (Advancement). This will be communicated via announcements and the weekly newsletter.

- Students earn holidays when they hit their goals. Seniors will receive an additional holiday (on Friday, April 12 Prom) if they sell (or buy-out) \$360 (36 total tickets).
- Raffle ticket sales are <u>not</u> transferrable from student to student.
  - For example: If "Johnny" sells more than his quota, he may not transfer his sells (give credit) to another student.
    - Why? It's not fair to Johnny because he did the work; it may impact his incentive awards; and it's not fair to other students.
- All tickets MUST be filled in. Blank tickets will be discarded.
- Cash and checks are acceptable forms of payment. Credit cards are accepted for online purchases and buy-out options.
- Once a collection envelope has been sealed, do not open!




