

SOUTH GIBSON SWEEPS CCMS HOOPS TEAMS

For three quarters, Coach Tyler Gadlen's Crockett County Middle School boys basketballers were within range of a significant upset.

But an 11-4 run in the final period of Monday night's game gave South Gibson a 43-29 win and capped a sweep of the evening's doubleheader. South Gibson's girls sailed past the Lady Cavaliers in the opener 40-17, holding Crockett without a field goal in the entire first half.

In the boys contest, South Gibson used eight first-quarter points by Jaxon Young to grab a 12-9 advantage, and increased it slightly to 19-13 at the half. But after three stanzas it was still tight at 32-25, but the Hornets closed it out when a key three-pointer by Brady Miller served as the dagger.

Young finished with 12 points and Brax Gibbons 10 for the winners, while Max Woods managed a game-high 13 for Crockett, which fell to 5-7 for the season. George Randall had seven points to back Woods, while Daniel Morgan added four and Carter Wren three.

The girls game began with South Gibson holding a 6-0 edge after the opening quarter. By halftime it was 25-4, with Crockett's points all coming from the free throw line. Sydney Smith finally broke the field goal drought in the third period, but it was the Lady Cavs' only bucket as the South Gibson advantage stretched to 38-7.

Crockett's Jentry Maddox scored seven of her team-high 10 points in the final quarter. Wesley Thornton finished with four for the Lady Cavs, who dropped to 4-8 for the season. Annalise Friend, who netted 11 points in the second period alone, paced the Lady Hornets with 15, five more than teammate Trinity Johnson.

Both Crockett teams travel to Milan for a twin bill Thursday.

Tonight, the high school squads have a 6:00 doubleheader at Trenton Peabody.
