Reminders:

- **Eden Prairie High School is having a winter coat drive** to help those students and families that may need a little extra warmth and comfort this time of year. The coat drive starts right away. New or gently used winter coats of all sizes can be dropped off at the MEDIA CENTER located at EPHS with Natasha Adams on school days from 8:45 AM-3:45 PM. These coats will be brought to the Eagle Nation Station free store where students can find one that fits their size and needs for themselves and their family members in need.

- ✚ Make sure you include an informative title and a clear description of your idea.

Phase Three: Data Interpretation and Results - Late January

Phase Four: Design Workshops - Early February

Phase Five: Project Testing & Implementation - February – March

- **Seniors:** The Direct Admissions program has taken the worry out of knowing where you stand. Check for the Direct Admissions e-mail which has details and instructions on how to participate. Fill out and submit the Google survey to mark which colleges that you're potentially interested in. Once that is submitted, hang tight and wait to hear back from those colleges with further instructions. Remember that you still have to apply to the colleges that you marked that you're interested in.

- **Eagles Homework Help & Tutoring** is a free program in which vetted volunteers provide support to students who are in need of additional academic help.

Who: The program serves Eden Prairie Schools students in grades K-12. Students identified for Targeted Services, are at risk of failing a class, are ML/EL students, and/or have an IEP will be prioritized in receiving tutoring time.

Where: Central Middle School's 800 wing on the east side of the building

When: Thursday Evenings, October 5th, 2023 through May 30th, 2024 (no tutoring when school is not in session)

Time: 6:00 - 8:00 pm; students must arrive by 7:30 to receive help. The length of tutoring sessions will vary depending on tutor availability.

The program is free, but registration is required (one-time enrollment into the program gives students access all year long).

Pizza is provided to all students, families, and tutors. Tutoring is provided by vetted volunteers under the supervision of a licensed teacher.
