DEFINITIONS

SOLO EVALUATION

TONE – The sound produced by the instrument

Playing Area - Striking area on instrument

Head Tension - The degree to which the head is tight or loose

Snare Tension - The degree to which the snares are tight or loose

Choice of Sticks - Sticks should be consistent with the drum size, style of the solo and performer's technique Choice of Instrument - An instrument which is of good quality, in good repair and appropriate to the style of solo

TECHNIQUE – The physical ability and mechanical dexterity required to produce notes correctly Hand Position - The manner in which sticks are held Stick Control - Preciseness of execution and muscular coordination Evenness of Rolls - Equal hand-to-hand sound of stick bounces Articulation - Clarity of rhythms Extraneous Sounds – Sounds not pertinent to the performance

ACCURACY – The exact realization of the notated music Accuracy of Rhythm – The performance of rhythms as written Pulse - The performance of natural accents implied by the meter of the composition

INTERPRETATION - The performer's realization of the composer's aesthetic intent and the performer's artistic expression Tempo – The speed of the music according to the metronomic, stylistic and/or expressive markings of the music Accents - Specific emphasis on notes as indicated Dynamics – The contrast between loud and soft Sticking - Appropriate use of right and left hands

MUSICIANSHIP - The quality which gives distinctive character and excellence to artistic expression Style - The understanding of the composer's musical intent consistent with the historical period of the composition Phrasing and Expression - The way written and/or unwritten dynamics are combined to give character to the solo Artistry – The performer's musical and expressive involvement in the music

Long Roll – Ability to perform a long roll

SIGHT-READING - Basic proficiency requirement - The ability to perform a musical excerpt (conforming to the criteria outlined in the NYSSMA Spring Evaluation Festival Rules and Regulations) at sight Accuracy of Rhythm – The performance of rhythms as written Accuracy of Tempo – The appropriate speed

Accuracy of Dynamics – The performance of dynamic levels as written
