DEFINITIONS

SOLO EVALUATION

TONE – The sound produced by the instrument

Playing Area - The striking area on the instrument

Head/Snare Tension – The degree to which head/snares are tight or loose

Accuracy of Pitches - The actual pitches are tuned/struck accurately

Tuning - The intervals are identifiable

Stroke – The manner in which the sound is produced

Choice of Sticks/Mallets – Sticks/Mallets should be consistent with the style of the composition

Choice of Instruments - Instruments should be of good quality and in good repair

TECHNIQUE - The physical ability and mechanical dexterity required to produce notes correctly

Hand Position - The manner in which sticks/mallets are held

Mallet/Stick Control - Preciseness of execution and muscular coordination

Evenness of Rolls - The ability to sustain a sound using evenly-spaced single strokes or stick bounces

Articulation – Clarity of rhythms

Extraneous Sounds – Sounds not pertinent to the performance

Muffling - Stopping the sound

ACCURACY - The exact realization of the notated music

Accuracy of Notes – The performance of notes as written

Accuracy of Rhythm – The performance of rhythms as written

Pulse – The performance of natural accents implied by the meter of the composition

BALANCE – The blending of sound and dynamics between instruments

INTERPRETATION – The performer's realization of the composer's aesthetic intent and the performer's artistic expression

Tempo – The speed of the music according to the metronomic, stylistic and/or expressive markings of the music

Accents - Specific emphasis on notes as indicated

Dynamics – The contrast between loud and soft

Sticking – Appropriate use of right and left hands

MUSICIANSHIP - The quality which gives distinctive character and excellence to artistic expression

Style – The understanding of the composer's musical intent consistent with the historical period of the composition Phrasing and Expression - The way written and/or unwritten dynamics are combined to give character to the solo

Artistry – The performer's musical and expressive involvement in the music

ENSEMBLE - The accurate and united coordination of the ensemble's performance

Entrances - The accurate initiation of tone

Releases - The accurate cessation of tone

Precision - The coordination of individual parts with other members of the ensemble
