Transportation (2800): Activities concerned with the conveyance of students to and from school and to activities. Statistical Services (2900): Activities, other than general administration, which support each of the other instructional and supporting services programs. e.g., Personnel and technology.

Community Services (3200): Payments made by the District to support activities that do not directly relate to providing education for pupils in the District.

**Extracurricular Activities (4000):** Subject matter and/or activities not provided in regular classes. Generally, participation is not required and credit is not given.

Capital Outlay (5000): Improvements to the District buildings & land. Contingencies (7000): To be used for unanticipated emergencies.

### 8-POINT MATH PLAN FOR GRADES K-8

- 1. Board policy will include "math fact fluency" as a consideration in promotion/retention decisions in grades 1-8. These grade-level expectations will be communicated through a variety of media including the web site under "Parents"; school newsletters; Open Houses & parent conferences; and math curriculum nights. Flash cards (and math games, where feasible) will be provided for every student at grades 1-8 to take home and practice with their parents.
- 2. The time allotted for math instruction will be lengthened at ES & IS. At MS, those who failed math OAA in grades 6 or 7 will get an extra period of math in their schedule through the Math/Science Lab. Math/Science Lab will be revamped to provide intervention in a different way, focusing on math skills and math/science projects.
- 3. Math teachers will supplement Math Investigations and Connected Math classroom instruction with materials approved and furnished by the Department of Teaching & Learning, focusing on skills. All new math teachers will receive training.
- 4. Math intervention specialists and Title I math teachers will assist students with math achievement gaps, as determined by OAA & Benchmark tests. They will ensure that students who failed OAA math the previous year receive appropriate intervention activities, including Study Island software. ESL teachers will focus on comprehending math vocabulary.
- 5. Two Title I Math coaches will provide on-site, ongoing professional development to K-8 teachers as long as federal funds are available.
- 6. After-school tutoring will focus on improved math fact fluency. The Department of Teaching & Learning will provide consistent training to external tutoring providers so that all tutoring is aligned with district programs. For example, if procedures are taught, they must be consistent with the way they are taught in school.
- 7. Students will be required to take cumulative Benchmark Tests in December and March. All students who fail their December Benchmark Test in grades 3-8 math will be required to attend afterschool tutoring, or be considered for retention the following school year. After-school transportation will be provided.
- 8. Where federal funding is available, fifth and sixth grade after-school tutoring will be provided in the fall for those who failed the previous year's OAA in math.
