Lynne Phelan Robinson, Class of 1971, recently received the 2022 McElroy Award from the Friends of Catholic Education (FOCE). The McElroy Award honors individuals whose actions and achievements have advanced Catholic school education in Frederick County. Lynne has been the Director of Athletics at Mount St. Mary's since 2007 and is one of only 50 female athletic directors in the NCAA Division 1 for colleges and universities, out of 357. Her accomplishments as Director of Athletics are numerous and include beginning the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, the Athletic Advisory Committee, and the Team Chaplaincy Program. In addition, she has served as an officer on the NACDA 1-AAA Athletic Director's Association and is currently a member of the NCAA Division 1 Woman's Lacrosse Committee.
