## The FSU-FSUS Collaboration: Beginning of A Tentative Framework

- 1. FSU is the critical sponsor of the FSUS Schools
- 2. Why did FSU sponsor the FSUS SCHOOLS?
  - The enduring value of tradition and the many individuals that it engages
  - The on-going value of the School as a research site for its faculty and students
  - The on-going value of the School as a pre-service training site for its students
  - The on-going value of the School as a test site for managerial and education implementations
- 3. How is the sponsorship related to the school charter?
  - FSUS shall operate the DRCS on behalf of FSU
  - The continuing sponsorship of the charter school is contingent
  - The contingencies related to reasons FSU agreed to sponsor
    - o Its value as a research site
    - o Its value as a pre-training site
    - o Its value as a test site
    - o Its value as a proud addition to the FSU tradition
- 4. What are FSU's interests in the school as a research site?
  - The school must meet certain quasi-experimental conditions with regard to demographics
  - The school must be operated in such a way that on-going research is valued, respected and given opportunities
- 5. What are FSU's interests in the school as a pre-training site?
  - The school must be operated in a safe and secure fashion
  - The school must be able to accommodate pre-training opportunities
  - The school must be operated in a fashion similar enough to most other schools that the pre-training experience is a reasonable approximation of those that will confront the students after graduation
- 6. What are FSU's interests in the school as a test site?
  - The school must be operated in such a way that it is open to the implementation of new best practices
- 7. What are FSU's interests in the maintenance of tradition?

- The school must operate in a way that does not diminish the FSU name and its partnership with the Seminole Tribe
- The school must operate in a way that does not reflect poorly on FSU in its fiscal, purchasing, accounting, human resource, security and facility practices
- The school should promote high performance among its students and faculty
- The school should not operate in such a fashion as to diminish the status or prospects of FSU in the political process
- 8. How should FSU go about insuring its interests are attended?
  - Through specificity in the charter
  - Through administrative and support relationships
  - Through the policies of the FSUS
- 9. What should the nature of the administrative and support relationships be?
  - Established agreements on fiscal, purchasing, human resources, security and facilities
  - FSU evaluation of the Director and Desired Results of the FSUS
