What is Redistricting?

- The process of establishing school attendance boundaries
- Every residential address in Akron
 Public Schools is assigned an elementary, middle, and high school

Why are we proposing redistricting?

Imbalance in enrollment

School Closures

Outdated School Facilities

Who determines scope of Redistricting?

- A recommendation is made to the School Board that redistricting is needed
- If the Board concurs, staff identifies anticipated impacted communities

Primary criteria

- Geographic proximity
- Projected enrollment
- Capacity
- Programmatic Changes

Redistricting Proposal Overview

- Firestone Park Elementary, Essex, and Stewart Building Closure
- Relief to Harris-Jackson CLC Elementary School
- Barber CLC zone moves into part of Harris-Jackson CLC zone
- Seiberling CLC then provides relief to Barber CLC
- David Hill CLC moves into the Garfield Cluster
- Portage Path CLC moves into the Buchtel Cluster

ELP Program

- Early Learning Program (ELP) classrooms will be in every cluster
- Buildings are being identified based on space for ELP classrooms and to ensure regulations are met




Akron Public Schools, OH 2023-24 Elementary School Zones







Proposed Clusters



Enrollment

- Families will receive personalized communication about their new school (or cluster) assignment
- Families will have enrollment options
 - Special Open Enrollment
 - Continuity



Special Open Enrollment

- "Open Enrollment" is a process in which students can enroll in another school building other than the school assigned.
- The special open enrollment window specifically for the schools affected by redistricting will be January 29, 2024 -February 9, 2024.

Enrollment

Grades KG-8th

- Automatic enrollment to assigned school
- Can apply for special open enrollment

Grades 9th-12th

- Continuity will be automatically granted for current scholars in their respective high schools
- Can apply for special open enrollment

Middle School Implications

- David Hill | East CLC to Innes CLC
 - Students living in the David Hill area that currently attend East CLC will now attend Innes CLC
- Harris-Jackson (Old Bettes area) | Jennings CLC to East CLC
 - Students living in the Harris-Jackson area that currently attend Jennings CLC will now attend East CLC
- Portage Path | Litchfield CLC to Buchtel CLC
 - Students living in the Portage Path area that currently attend Litchfield
 CLC will now attend Buchtel CLC

Transportation

Review of Transportation Standards

- Ohio K-8 students residing less than 2.0 miles from assigned school building are not eligible for bus transport.
- High school students will continue to use METRO bus service.
- New bus routes will be determined based on new attendance boundaries
- Students who open enroll are not provided bus transportation
- Safety issues can be reviewed once required bus service routing is determined
- Special Education and McKinney-Vento transportation will continue to be met as required per student
