

OVERVIEW

We believe that school facilities are community buildings that should reflect the neighborhood where they are constructed.

The Visual Preference Survey is used by the designers at ThenDesign Architecture (TDA) to better understand the preferred design style for the exterior of the new K-12 campus in Fairport Harbor.

A survey of 20 sets of images (40 images total) of different school facilities were presented for respondents to consider. Respondents had the opportunity to select from and comment on building features such as design style, building materials, number of floors, window styles, colors, patterns, and playgrounds.

The results found in this report reflect the design preferences of 152 respondents from Fairport Harbor Exempted Village School District's community.

TDA's design team has reviewed the survey results, and have incorporated the feedback into the design of the building.

Overall, respondents expressed that the features they find important in a school facility include:

- A contemporary design style while utilizing traditional school design aesthetics to:
 - a) fit the architecture already found in the community,
 - · Fits in the community
 - "Fairport Feel" / Feels like Fairport Harbor
 - Anecdotally, respondents share that they prefer the design style of a "traditional school"
 - b) prioritizes student experience and safety
 - · Areas where students can wait for pick up in inclement weather
 - c) look inviting and welcoming for students
 - "Simple"
 - "Modern"
 - "inviting to students of all ages"
- Anecdotally, respondents share that the school design should "look like a school," be inviting and exemplify the exterior traits of a traditional school building.
- Playground:
 - secure area
 - prioritizes student safety
 - fun for kids
 - visibility for recess monitors
- The most liked buildings were 14a (131), 10a (128), and 7a (123) (LEFT)
- Anecdotally respondents did not like option 12 buildings (BELOW)






- 1. Feels more like Fairport. The other building is too modern and abstract, it would feel out of place in the town.

- 5. I like the direct view of the building and property displaying the path to the parking lot.




