Board Achievement Committee Meeting

Rough Minutes

Karen welcomes everyone and thanks everyone for attendance. Then reviews the areas of the report card Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Preparing Readers, Success. Karen reviewed the basic results before reviewing questions she had asked Mrs. Rumbarger and Mrs. Elmore regarding testing and achievement. They included information about testing and systems they use to evaluate readiness for state tests. Karen understands that COVID remains a factor in testing results.

Bill asked about the percentage achieved and what that data was based on, indicators possible.

Absenteeism was addressed with a link provided. Remote learning and accommodations made for students still struggling. Attendance was down.

Progress in Math, ELA, Science, Gifted students was explained. Progress monitoring is done quarterly at both buildings. MTSS teams were mentioned as an intervention. The percentages of students on track to hit the benchmark and the grades and subjects that were addressed. Fairport posted adequate and minimal growth in English and Language Arts in grade 5.

House Bill 82 includes reform in 2021-22 for the report card using the 6 components that we discussed. Chronic absenteeism last year for the state last year was 10.4% Gap Closing in English, Language Arts, Math, and English proficiency. Do Gaps exist? No data from 2020 to show growth at the high school. Remediation is being done with kids who need assistance reaching proficiency. GAP closing seems on pace with previous school year. The issue seems to continue to be a lack of data from last year.

582 students across the entire district including the hybrid. Going 5 days in-person until May 1st. The value of learning in school was reinforced.

Graduation rate is a student that receives their diploma in 2 to 5 years. Have steps been taken to reach graduation and are students on track. Is summer school an option and do we know if students are on track with community service? Graduation goal remains 100% and at-risk students have been identified and those families have met with the counselor.

Open enrollment represents a commitment of those families and their faith in our district and program. Some students still need community service hours to graduate. 69 student readers at McKinley were identified as off-track with 21 of those students now on track. Over half are currently tracking as proficient.

All students take the ACT and 9 honors diplomas were awarded last year. The ACT dates March 8-10. Students' data on post secondary comes from colleges in the second semester. Counselors start working with ACC and the counselor in the fall of their 9-10 grades year. The same goes for promoting CCP.

Progress monitoring was done weekly this fall. The Nov 2 in-service was used to integrate that data into targeted instruction. Two Title 1 teachers at McKinley are providing support to students. We encourage all students at McKinley to participate in the summer bridge programs for acclimation academically and socially.

Teacher's at Fairport 94.7% have their bachelors and 59% have their masters. Our district is 5 of 185 financially ranked. Our local spending per student is just over \$2,000. Karen thanked the principals for the information provided and encouraged everyone.

Mrs Holbrooks had some questions regarding how these are different from administrative committees and how they are being used. The role of these committees will change as time goes on. Discussions of the last year were with reminders of the upcoming committees. Responsibility to the staff and community for accountability, transparency, and sharing. The direction we are going is up. Confirmed that this year all Juniors are required to take the ACT. The ACC pathway was also reviewed and the new donation was touched on. Students outside the district are a challenge for chasing down for graduation and the camaraderie that comes with class-based identity.
