



~90% / \$55M


OSD operating budget spent on staffing & benefits

If we want to remain a "destination" district and maintain high staff retention rates, then we must offer compensation that keeps up with inflation and is competitive.



OSD Strategies to Address Budget Shortfalls



- Continued budget review and analysis
- Changed health insurance to lower costs and lock in rates
- Used one-time ESSER funds for COVID-related expenses and student mental health support staffing
- Restructured debt

Total Expense Reduction: \$2M

A Note About One-Time Funds

On August 30, Gov. Evers announced an allocation of one-time Federal funds to schools...

One-Time Federal Funds Allocated to OSD (2022-2023)

- \$350,289 for this school year
- \$61,054 for mental health support (Get Kids Ahead Initiative)


While we appreciate the fund allocations, it is *one-time* money. Even if these were ongoing funds, the total would be less than 1% of our annual salary and benefits budget.

How Other Districts Are Addressing Budget Shortfalls



- Using one-time funds for operations
- Reducing services / staff
- Increasing class sizes
- Receiving funds from operational referendum (April)
- Seeking funds through operational referendum (November)

Operational Referendum Priorities



Community Feedback

- Continue to attract & retain best educators
- Keep class sizes similar to today
- Continue providing mental health services & positions
- Adjust staff salaries to be competitive with neighboring school districts and keep up with inflation
- Address operational budget needs now

November 8 Referendum

Exceed Revenue Limit by \$11.4M over 3 years

- Year 1: 2022-2023 | \$5.42 M
- Year 2: 2023-2024 | \$3.00 M
- Year 3: 2024-2025 | \$2.98M



November 8 Referendum Tax Impact

Year	Amount / Year (Total over 3 years: \$11,400,000)	Projected Tax Impact (\$100,000 of assessed property value)
Year 1: 2022-2023	\$5,420,000	\$98
Year 2: 2023-2024	\$3,000,000	\$95
Year 3: 2024-2025	\$2,980,000	\$66

This chart shows the additional increase each year over three years. The amount totals \$11.4M after three years. It is a recurring referendum; the amount stays at \$11.4M each year thereafter.

Shall the Oregon School District, Dane, Green and Rock Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$5,420,000 for the 2022-2023 school year; by an additional \$3,000,000 (for a total of \$8,420,000) for the 2023-2024 school year; and by an additional \$2,980,000 (for a total of \$11,400,000) for the 2024-2025 school year and thereafter, for recurring purposes consisting of expenses to pay compensation and to sustain District instruction and operations?
