




#### **High School Selection Guide**




#### **CUSD High School Performance vs. Similar Districts**


CAASSP: The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) is the state academic testing program. CAASPP is a system intended to provide information that can be used to monitor student progress and ensure that all students leave high school ready for college and career.




HS Graduation: It all begins with graduating from High School! Students must earn a High School diploma in order to obtain a job and attend college. Compton Unified beats local districts.




**A-G:** Compton Unified beats local districts and state in A-G completion. A-G is important as these are the set of 15 courses that students must pass in order to be eligible for admission at both the CSU and UC systems. Beginning with the Class of 2024, all students will be required to pass all A-G courses in order to graudate.



**Dual Enrollment:** College course offerings are important as they can provide students with the opportunity to earn college credit for free while still in high school. Students who take college courses will also increase the chances of being admitted to selective universities, save money and graduate sooner from college.



**College Acceptance:** *"Compton Goes to College"* is the College & Career's mantra to ensure that the community of Compton has the same opportunities that any other student from any other community. Data below indicates that students from Compton are equal to, if not exceeding other local similar districts to both the UC and CSU.

Beginning in the 9th grade students will be required to complete about 12 college courses to total 37 semester units.

3-Year Bachelor's degree program will allow for high school rising juniors who are interested in becoming a healthcare professional to complete college level courses beginning the summer prior to 11th grade & throughout senior year. After High School, students complete 1 year at Compton College, students continue their education through a transfer pathway to Charles R. Drew University to earn a Bachelor's Degree in 3 years post-high school graduation

#### **College Readiness Department**

Compton Unified School District (CUSD) has a variety of College Readiness Programs and Services to ensure that your students receive support throughout their 4 years of High School to be admitted to the college of their choice.

The goal is for every student to graduate from high school ready for life after high school and become a contributing member of society by:

- 1. Graduating from High School
- 2. Graduating having completed all of the A-G requirements (Cs or better)
- 3. Taking 2 College Courses and/or Advanced Placement (AP) Courses
- 4. Completing a CTE Pathway

**College Centers**: Every High School has a College/Career Center that is run by **Higher Education Coordinators** who coordinate an array of services and programing that includes: college field trips, scholarships, college application, & FAFSA support.

**High School Counselors**: CUSD has professional School Counselors who have earned their Master's Degrees in School Counseling to support your students not only through the college going process but also with the whole child: Academic, Social/Emotional & College/Career.

#### USC College Advising Corps:

#### Locations: All High Schools

The mission of the USC College Advising Corps is to improve college outcomes for low-income, first-generation, and underrepresented students. The goal of the program is to raise the number of California students who attend and complete college by encouraging and assisting high school students with their college searches, college applications, financial aid, and making the transition to postsecondary education. As we continue to impact college-going rates with students, we also seek to create partnerships with local districts and schools. #### CSU Long Beach-CALSOAP

#### Locations: All High Schools

The California Student Opportunity and Access Program (Cal-SOAP) was established by the state legislature in 1978 to improve the flow of information about postsecondary education and financial aid while raising the achievement levels of students who were historically underrepresented in post-secondary education. Today, there are 16 Cal-SOAP projects that bring together California school districts, public and private colleges and universities, community-based organizations and private sector partners to form a consortium.

#### UC Irvine Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP): Locations: All High Schools

The Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) was established in 1976 by the University of California (UC) to increase the number of students from underserved communities who have the opportunity to achieve a college education. As the UC's largest academic preparation program, EAOP helps students prepare for college by ensuring they meet all UC and California State University admissions requirements. Through EAOP services, students are provided the support necessary to plan their academics accordingly, apply to college, complete financial aid applications, and successfully transition to college.

#### Gear Up: Cal State Dominguez Hills

Locations: Dominguez High School, Compton HS (9<sup>th</sup> Grade) Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Program (GEAR UP) is a federally funded program designed to elevate the academic achievement, college attendance, and graduation rates of first-generation, low-income, underrepresented, and underserved students. GEAR UP works in partnership with educational and community institutions to provide students and families with one-on-one and group advising, academic and tutoring support, college and career exploration opportunities, skill building workshops, enrichment programs, college visits, and educational field trips.



#### Gear Up: UC Irvine

#### Locations: Early College HS, Compton HS

Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) is a federally funded program designed to elevate the academic achievement, college attendance, and graduation rates of first-generation, low-income, underrepresented, and underserved students. In partnership with local entities, UC Irvine has two GEAR UP Partnership Projects that serve 2,000 students in Compton, beginning at the middle schools. The seven-year GEAR UP project provides multiple academic activities and services for four cohorts of students in the Compton Unified School District, the Classes of 2024, 2025, 2027, and 2028. GEAR UP will follow these students through high school and their freshman year in college.









#### Cal State Long Beach Educational Talent Search (ETS)

#### Locations: Centennial, Compton HS, Dominguez

The Educational Talent Search (ETS) program has been helping low-income and potential first-generation students successfully graduate from secondary school and enroll in post-secondary education since 1977. Targeting 13 high schools in the Long Beach/Los Angeles area, ETS advisors guide students in their search for higher-education enrollment and career possibilities. College tours, career planning, and scholarship and financial aid resources are among the many things ETS offers for students attending target schools. ETS is a free, federally-funded program housed at California State University, Long Beach since 1977.

#### Upward Bound Math & Science: Compton College

#### Locations: Centennial, Compton HS, Dominguez

The Upward Bound Math & Science Program is a motivational, challenging, and enriching federally funded TRiO program for high school students. The program specifically targets high school students who are interested in pursuing careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). The mission of the program is to help low income and/or first-generation college bound students achieve success at the post-secondary level by facilitating high school completion and entry, retention, and completion of post-secondary education. The program provides academic instruction through a six-week residential program, yearround support in preparing students for college admission, and opportunities for exposure to new technology and developments in the world of science.

#### Upward Bound Math & Science: Cal State Long Beach

Locations: Centennial, Compton HS, Dominguez

Upward Bound serves high school students from low-income families, high school students from families in which neither parent holds a bachelor's degree, and low-income, first-generation students who are preparing to enter postsecondary education and demonstrate academic need. Our services provide fundamental support to participants in their preparation for college entrance as well as opportunities for participants to succeed in pre-college performance and ultimately in higher education pursuits.

# **Academic Preparation**













#### Early College Satellite

Locations: Centennial, Compton HS, Dominguez

As an extension of Compton Early College HS, the satellite program will allow students to complete their Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC), which is a series of courses that California community college students may complete to satisfy the lower-division breadth/general education requirements before transferring to the California State University (CSU) or to the University of California (UC). Beginning in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be required to complete about 12 college courses to total 37 semester units. **Dominguez & Centennial HS are the only 2 schools in LA County that received an Exemplary Dual Enrollment Award in LA County and 2 out of the total 9 that were awarded in the entire state!** 

#### **College Courses: Compton College**

**Locations**: Centennial, Compton HS, Dominguez, Early College Any student is able to take college courses FREE via Compton College during the school day, after school or during the summer. Students will earn college credit, which will increase the chances of getting into the college of their choice, save \$\$\$, save time and graduate sooner.

#### 3 Year Degree Program (Compton College, Charles Drew)

#### Locations: Dominguez High School

The 3-Year Bachelor's degree program will allow for high school rising juniors who are interested in becoming a healthcare professional to complete college level courses beginning the summer prior to 11th grade & throughout senior year. After High School, students complete 1 year at Compton College to earn an Associate degree in General Studies: Social and Behavioral Sciences. Upon completion of the AA degree, students continue their education through a transfer pathway to Charles R. Drew University to earn a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biomedical Sciences, Psychology, or Public Health within 2 years. Ultimately their goal is to complete their Bachelor's degree in 3 years post high school graduation.

#### Advanced Placement Courses

#### Locations: All High Schools

The AP Program offers college-level courses and exams that you can take in high school. Taking AP courses and exams in high school could give you an advantage in college by letting you: Earn College Credit and Placement, Save Money and Time, Stand Out to Colleges, & Keep Your Options Open. CUSD offers over 20 different AP classes. AP exams are free and paid for by the district. Compton Early College & Dominguez High Schools both received the <u>AP Honor Roll Award</u> for 2023!

### **Pre-AP**<sup>®</sup>

### 



#### Locations: All High Schools

Pre-AP features grade-level instruction intended to give all students the opportunity for growth. Pre-AP offers a focused framework, instructional support, model lessons, classroom assessments, and an optional final exam. Pre-AP focuses on skills that students will need to succeed in AP courses, college, and careers.

#### **Honor Courses**

#### Locations: All High Schools

Honor level courses are offered at all high schools when AP or Pre-AP courses are not offered. Similar to AP and Pre-AP students will earn an extra point in their GPA for advanced and more rigorous coursework.

#### A-G Coursework

#### Locations: All High Schools

CUSD has adopted A-G coursework as the default graduation requirement for all students beginning with the Class of 2024. Students will be expected to take a set of 15 courses in a variety of disciplines, while earning C's or better. By passing A-G courses, students will become eligible for admissions to the UC and or CSU university system.





#### Avid

#### Locations: All High Schools

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is an in-school academic support program for grades seven through twelve. The purpose of the program is to prepare students for college eligibility and success. AVID places academically average students in advanced classes; levels the playing field for minority, rural, low-income, and other students without a college-going tradition in their families; and targets students in the academic middle--B, C, and even D students--who have the desire to go to college and the willingness to work hard.

#### NAF

#### Locations: Centennial, Compton HS, and Dominguez

NAF takes students beyond what traditional high schools offer by providing access to the tools that will help them navigate and build skills for what's next, whether that's college, a career, or another pathway. Future leaders benefit from personalized, career-connected learning, when they enroll in our Academies of Engineering, Finance, Health Sciences, Hospitality & Tourism, Information Technology, and additional programs of study that are aligned with the National Career Clusters Framework.

### **Career Technical Education**



Career Technical Education (CTE) Is a program of study that involves a multiyear sequence of courses that integrates core academic knowledge with technical and occupational knowledge to provide students with a pathway to postsecondary education and careers. Every HS student is expected to complete a CTE pathway to ensure that they are both College & Career Ready. Below are the CTE pathways offered by each High School:

#### Sport Clearance Packet

Each student participating in a sport must complete a sport clearance packet before the season starts. Please use the forms in the athletic locker for clearance.

#### **General Athletic Information**

1. Physicals and sport packets are required for each sport. The sport physical needs to run through your season of sport. Coaches will hand out packets to athletes or they may be obtained through the front office. If athletes play a second sport in a school year, they will not be required to do another physical but will have to fill out another sport packet. This pertains to school year not summer.

2. Insurance is required during summer and school year. Health insurance can be purchased for a nominal fee.

3. Athletes are required to maintain a 2.0 GPA to stay eligible for sports. EVERY progress report counts. If you drop under a 2.0 at the end of any grading period, you will be put on probation. You are required by the end of the next grading period to be above a 2.0. If not, you are ineligible for the rest of the calendar year. You are only allowed to be on probation once every school year. These are League Rules which supersede CIF.

5. All parents and players will be given a summer sports camp application that must be signed and turned in before an athlete can participate in summer sports.


