RE: No. 1 – Special Procurements Authorizing a Specific Product Specification

**EXPLANATION:** 

Earlier in the evening, the board held a hearing of the Local Contract Review Board to review Findings of Fact supporting the district's ability to specify particular products or systems upon making certain findings. The items under consideration are fire alarm systems and public address systems. These procurement items were included in the 2016 capital improvement bond approved by voters on November 8, 2016.

This process is an allowed method of procurement by ORS Statute and will provide for efficient utilization of existing equipment by acquiring compatible equipment, result in substantial cost savings and is unlikely to encourage favoritism in awarding contracts.

Notice of the sole source procurement was advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce on September 9, 2017. In the advertisement, the administration directed that "written protests must be in accordance with OAR 137-047-0710(3) and shall include a detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds for the protest, a description of the resulting harm to the affected person, and the relief requested."

A protest was submitted in a timely manner by Convergint Technologies. An analysis by the administration is as follows:

Convergint Technologies suggests "the reason for our protest is that there are several qualified, UL Listed fire alarm system manufacturer's that can meet and/or exceed the fire alarm system requirements for any school district facility." Also "by sole sourcing "Gamewell-FCI" it will limit the amount of competition and several local fire alarm system providers' ability to respond to new projects, retrofits and services."

District Response. ORS 279C.345 states the following:

279C.345 Specifications for contracts; exemptions. (1) Specifications for public improvement contracts may not expressly or implicitly require any product by any brand name or mark, nor the product of any particular manufacturer or seller unless the product is exempt under subsection (2) of this section.

Re: No. 1 – Special Procurements Authorizing a Specific Product Specification

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(2) The Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, a local contract review board or, for contracts described in ORS 279A.050 (3)(b), the Director of Transportation may exempt certain products or classes of products from subsection (1) of this section upon <u>any</u> of the following findings:

(a) It is unlikely that the exemption will encourage favoritism in the awarding of public improvement contracts or substantially diminish competition for public improvement contracts;

(b) The specification of a product by brand name or mark, or the product of a particular manufacturer or seller, would result in substantial cost savings to the contracting agency;

(c) There is only one manufacturer or seller of the product of the quality required; or

(d) Efficient utilization of existing equipment or supplies requires the acquisition of compatible equipment or supplies. [2003 c.794 §107; 2007 c.764 §19]

The administration agrees there are a number of fire alarm systems on the market. However, since the district uses Gamewell-FCI in 8 of 19 schools currently, the administration believes there is significant cost savings and efficient utilization of existing equipment by specifying Gamewell-FCI. Factors like standardized parts, maintenance, training and technology interface contribute to the cost savings. Additionally, there are multiple installers of Gamewell-FCI to encourage, not diminish competition or favoritism.

BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Directors acting in the capacity of the Local Contract Review Board adopts the Findings of Fact reviewed at the September 28, 2017 Local Contract Review Board Hearing and grants a specific exemption from competitive bidding requirements as allowed under ORS 279C.345 to specify particular products or systems including fire alarm systems and public address systems for these procurement items identified by the administration to be in the best interest of the Gresham-Barlow School District and deny the protest dated September 20, 2017 regarding Gamewell-FCI protest.

## GRESHAM-BARLOW SCHOOL DISTRICT LOCAL CONTRACT REVIEW BOARD HEARING September 28, 2017

# REVIEW FINDINGS OF FACT FOR SPECIAL PROCUREMENTS and EXCEPTION from COMPETITIVE BIDDING AUTHORIZING A SPECIFIC PRODUCT SPECIFICATION

#### SITUATION

The design work on many projects approved by voters in November 2016 is well underway. The management team has reviewed a number of systems and has some specific recommendations regarding the following:

- 1. Fire Alarm Systems
- 2. Public Address Systems

Historically, public improvement contracts are competitively bid and awarded to the responsible low bidder and such solicitation may not specify particular products or equipment. During recent project coordination meetings, the financial and operational benefits to purchase and install specific types Fire Alarm and Public Address Systems have been discussed. This process involves the selection of the type and Fire Alarm and Public Address systems during the design phase and specifies the selected product and systems in construction documents, which are publicly advertised, for all District buildings. In all cases listed above, use of the same systems throughout the district will make repairs, upgrades, installation of new systems, maintenance, replacement, training and operation much more efficient. The Projects will require tight schedule adherence to resolve issues that could impact timely completion.

Public Agencies that have used this process include:

- Beaverton School District
- Salem-Keizer School District
- Oregon State University

ORS 279C.345 permits the Local Contract Review Board, which for Gresham-Barlow School District is the Board of Directors, to specify particular products or systems upon making certain findings. In doing so, the statute specifically says that the Local Contract Review Board shall: "where appropriate, allow the purchase of products or systems from a particular manufacturer or seller."

Oregon law and duly adopted resolution of the Gresham-Barlow School District permits the Gresham-Barlow School District Board of Directors, acting as the Local Contract Review Board, to consider and approve specific findings that allow Special Procurements and Exemptions from Competitive Bidding.

The Oregon Public Contracting Rules requires Gresham-Barlow School District to hold a public hearing of the Local Contract Review Board to allow comments and make a final decision on the Gresham-Barlow School District draft findings. Notice of this public hearing must be advertised in at least one trade newspaper of general statewide circulation not less than 14 days prior to the hearing.

Notice of public hearing was advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce on September 9,2016.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

## **Project Descriptions**

Install new, upgrade, renovate or expand fire alarm systems in new and existing buildings.

Install new, upgrade, renovate or expand public address systems in new and existing buildings.

#### Rationale

Based upon the above analysis, selection of a particular product or system for fire alarm and public address in new or existing buildings and then specifying the same product or system for all district buildings, qualifies for an exemption from competitive bidding based upon the following findings under ORS 279C.345(2):

Efficient utilization of existing equipment requires acquisition of compatible equipment. By acquiring compatible equipment the district will realize similar training and maintenance for school and district staff, fewer parts to stock and better integration.

The specification of a product by brand name or mark, or the product of a particular manufacturer or seller, could result in a substantial cost savings.

It is unlikely that the exemption will encourage favoritism in awarding public improvement contracts. There are multiple vendors who can install the equipment.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Superintendent recommends the Board of Directors, acting in the capacity of the Local Contract Review Board, review and approve the Findings of Fact allowing Special Procurements and Exemptions from Competitive Bidding fire alarm and public address systems when the administrative project management team believes it is in the best interest of Gresham-Barlow School District and to deny the protest brought forward by Convergint Technologies.

#### To Whom It May Concern:

We are responding to the public notice that indicated that "Gamewell-FCI" will be the sole source selection for fire alarm systems for the Gresham-Barlow School District. The reason for our protest is that there are several qualified, UL Listed fire alarm system manufacturer's that can meet and/or exceed the fire alarm system requirements for any school district facility. By sole sourcing "Gamewell-FCI" it will limit the amount of competition and several local fire alarm system providers' ability to respond to new projects, retrofits and services. In accordance to the sole-source OAR 137-047-0275 the goods and services must be available from only one source. When it comes to fire alarm building systems this is just not the case. Below is a list of other products that can be used in lieu of Gamewell-FCI. By allowing multiple system manufacturer's it will lower the cost to the district by increasing competition for these systems.
