MEDICATION REMINDER!

School personnel may not give children medication without written permission from the parent/guardian and doctor. Parents must bring the medication to the school office and complete the required district form before the medication can be given. Students may never transport medication. Prescription medication must be prepared and labeled by a pharmacist at the direction of a physician. The district requires a signed permission form and instructions from the student's parent, which includes: name of student, name of medication, route, dosage and frequency of administration will be needed. Prescription medication must remain in the original container from the pharmacy or doctor's office. Nonprescription medication must be brought to school in original container or packaging, and must follow recommended guidelines for dosage. Nonprescription medication means only commercially prepared, nonalcohol based medication to be taken during school hours that is necessary for the student to remain in school.

Winter Dance - December 8th

Springwater's winter dance is scheduled for Friday, December 8, from 7-9 pm in the cafeteria. Formal dressing is NOT required. Please wear what you feel comfortable in. Procedures for Guest Passes

In order for a Springwater student to bring a non-Springwater guest to our dances, a guest pass form must be completed and turned into Mr. Blaszak for approval by 3:00 pm on Thursday December 7th. It is then the student's job to return and pick it up. The completed guest pass must be presented at the time the ticket is purchased during lunches the week of the dance. Guest pass forms are available in the main office starting Monday, November 27. No guests younger than 9th grade or 21 and older are permitted at Springwater dances. In addition, faxing the form to or from our school office is not allowed. It is the student's responsibility to obtain the required signatures.

Día de los Muertos

Spanish students did a cultural activity to learn about the Day of the Dead (El Día de los Muertos) which is a traditional celebration throughout Mexico and Central America on Nov. 1 and 2. The custom dates back to pre-Hispanic times, and is a way to remember and celebrate the lives of loved ones who have passed on. Our study is in no way religious, but instead an exploration of the differences in traditions, especially between Halloween and Day of the Dead. The celebration in those Spanish -speaking countries is lively, joyful, and fun. The ancient idea is that the spirits of ancestors and loved ones can cross the barrier between worlds on that day of the year, and return to see and hear the people they left behind. For this reason the atmosphere is not sad, but festive, to welcome the spirits and show them a good time. Part of the tradition is to decorate a place in the home with flowers, candles, and things that the honored spirits enjoyed in life.
