

Dear Springwater community,

We are off to another great school year! We have three new staff members joining the Springwater team: teachers Jeff Martinich, Amy Wolf, and Michael Duffy. I encourage you to read more about them on page 2.

Thank you to those who chimed in with feedback regarding August registration. We are compiling your ideas and intend to create a much more streamlined process next year.

Over the next 3 weeks we have 2 field trips and a financial aid night for juniors and seniors. We must receive your completed permission slip(s) prior to our field trips. Our office will be reaching out to you in the next few days if we still need your forms. This year we have achieved the lowest class size in almost 10 years for our Integrated 1 (formerly Algebra 1) math classes. Our average class size in Integrated 1 is 16 students. Given the challenges many students face in math, and the district adoption of a new math curriculum this school year, it is wonderful we have been able to adjust our schedule and teaching priorities to decrease our class sizes in this critical area. As we look ahead, I am exploring creative solutions to decrease our other core class sizes.

#### **PSAT**

Wednesday, Oct. 11th will **NOT** be a late start - all buses will run on the regular schedule. All sophomores will be taking the PSAT in the morning. This test is a 3 1/2 hour test on reading, writing and math. Your child was given a practice test booklet. Please take some time to look through the booklet and encourage them to look at the test questions.

Juniors are encouraged to take this test, especially if they are thinking about applying for university admission their senior year or have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or above.

Juniors need to sign up in the office. The cost is \$16 to take the test. Students on free and reduced lunch will not be charged. They can register before school, after school and during lunch. They will not be allowed to do so during class. The deadline to register is Monday, Oct. 9th.

All Freshmen, Seniors and Juniors not taking the PSAT will have a regularly scheduled day.

#### Four reasons to take the PSAT

- 1. It sets students up to be better prepared to take either the SAT or ACT which is required for university admissions
- 2. Students get feedback from College board regarding their scores, how they compare to others and where they can improve
- 3. Most students find they score better than they thought they would, which is a great motivator for college and career planning.
- 4. It is the only opportunity to determine if a student is a National Merit Scholar and Hispanic National Merit.

#### Senior Information from Ms. Centurion

As you begin your senior year I look forward to working with you on your journey beyond high school (college applications process, scholarships, apprenticeships, trade schools).

- -As your counselor, I hope to meet with each student/ parent in the month of October to help finalize your list of colleges and/or advise you on your next steps.
- -I encourage all students and parents to attend the Financial Aid Night on Tuesday, September 19th from 6-8, here at Springwater Trail.
- -Be aware of SAT and ACT test and registration dates. Test dates through December will work in relation to most college deadlines ( this is not true for some early action or early decision deadlines- check with colleges as necessary) -Students will need to order their transcripts through the main office. Transcripts are free but please allow a 2-business day turnaround. You are responsible for supplying the stamp and the mailing address.
- -Adult volunteers will be connecting with individual seniors to support them weekly. If you are interested, please let me know.
- -Western Oregon State University field trip- Instant WOLF Friday, September 29th. All students applying to WOU will have a chance to apply and be accepted in the same day. Parents are encouraged to join us.
- -PSU Instant Viking November 2nd at Springwater be ready with your application, transcript and application fee.
- -More to come about Oregon Promise, scholarships, Springwater College Application Week.
