MIDYEAR REPORTS

IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO APPLY!

If you are a senior, who is still contemplating college, know that you have not missed your opportunity to apply. There are many schools with March 1 and later application deadlines, and others with rolling admissions which accept students throughout the summer. Additionally, several colleges have kept open their applications beyond their posted deadlines, in light of the challenging circumstances that the pandemic has provided. As always, be sure to see me if you need help with any part of this process.



APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Continue to research and apply for scholarships. Remember that Naviance is just one tool to help you search. It is updated on a regular basis, so check back often. There are many scholarship search engines out there, but be cautious of scholarship scams as well. Never pay anyone who guarantees they will find you a scholarship and do not share overly personal (financial) information.



REGISTER FOR SPRING TESTS

Throughout spring there are opportunities to take the <u>ACT</u> and/or the <u>SAT</u>. Check with the colleges and universities which you may be considering. Are they requiring test scores in their admissions decisions? Some have decided to continue their test optional policies indefinitely or at least through 2024. <u>Learn more from FairTest.</u> Students who took the PSAT in October should sign up for FREE Official SAT Practice and send your scores to Khan Academy.
