Welcome 2023!! It is hard to believe that we are already halfway through the school year. I feel the first half of the year has been filled with lots of learning and fun for our students.

Spencerville Elementary is excited to present our first annual family Game Train event, scheduled for March 9 from 5:45-6:45. Lots of fun activities are being planned for students and parents!! More details to follow but mark your calendars now for this exciting event!

It is hard to believe the school year is half over already. It seems like yesterday we just started the school year. As we start the second semester, I cannot stress enough to parents to stay on top of your son/daughters grades. Parents can log into Progress-

Book and see how their child is performing in all their classes. Parents can also set up alerts to be notified if your son/daughter is missing assignments. Please take advantage of this great resource.

During the next few months, Mr. Baumgartner will be meeting with students for next year's classes/schedules. Mr. Baumgartner does a fantastic job of explaining all the requirements for each grade level. If your son/daughter is a sophomore or junior and is interested in Apollo, it is important they speak with Mr. Baumgartner and register online as well. Several programs at Apollo fill up quickly. If you have any questions regarding scheduling for next year, please do not hesitate to contact Mr. Baumgartner or myself.

I know spring seems a long way off with the cold temperatures we had over break, but it will be here before we know it. During the spring, we will have the ACT and state testing. On some of the days, we will be running on an adjusted schedule. The testing dates will be as follows:

- · ACT for juniors will be February 28th, with a make-up date of March 14th
- · 3rd 4th grade ELA will be April 12th and 13th
- · 5th 8th grade ELA and High School English II will be April 18th and 19th
- · 3rd 4th grade Math will be April 25th and 26th
- · 5th 8th grade Math and High School Algebra I and Geometry will be April 27th and 28th
- \cdot 5th & 8th grade Science and High School Biology, American History, and Government will be May 3rd and 4th

We recognize that our students work very hard and do not want these tests to cause anxiety. We would like you to discuss the importance of the tests with your child, as they are important to our district. They allow us to analyze the effectiveness of our academic programs and make needed changes to ensure our students are getting the best education possible. For the high school classes, this is a requirement for graduation. You can help alleviate any stress your child may feel by making sure he or she gets adequate sleep the night before and proper nutrition the morning of his or her test.

I know the seniors are counting down the days until graduation. While it seems like a long way off, it will be here before we know it. Graduation will be held Sunday, May 28th at 2pm in the competition gym. Just a reminder, school, athletic, and Apollo fees will need to be taken care of by May 1st.

Women in STEM

In October, twenty 8th grade girls attended Women in STEM Day on the campus of BGSU.

Students spent the day exploring and performing experiments in physics, engineering, mathematics and technology as they learned about the STEM fields and what STEM has to offer in high school and beyond. Presenters from a wide range of STEM professions offered breakout sessions and hands-on workshops throughout the day.

The keynote presentation was by Lydia Denton, a 14-year-old inventor from North Carolina. She is a teen inventor whose personal challenges inspire her creations. She's on a mission to get girls interested in STEM. She spoke on how she finds a problem in life and uses them as fuel for her inventions. Her biggest invention at this time is "Beat the Heat Car Seat" that can tell when a child has been left in a car and initiates a call to emergency services for rescue if the temperature in the vehicle becomes dangerously hot.





The girls then attended three break-out sessions during the day that provided hands-on, fun-filled, critical thinking/learning activities. They spent time studying life sciences with women from Bowling Green where they had to determine if specimens under the microscope were made of cells or not. They also worked with ladies from Perrysburg on creating ramps to make a car move the fastest and farthest. Their final stop for the day was working with Imagination Station from Toledo to build the slowest moving marble run. They ended their day with a short tour of BGSU campus.

The goal of the Women in STEM Program is to provide a rewarding experience for these girls that connects STEM education to the real world and sparks an interest in pursuing STEM majors in college and ultimately STEM careers.

Women in STEM provides young women with a positive experience at BGSU and offers them a variety of engaging hands-on activities that allows them the opportunity to learn and interact with successful STEM role models. The ultimate goal of this program is to help young women recognize the wide array of options available in STEM fields that inspire them to take classes in the STEM fields throughout their educational careers.

Superintendent's Update

It is hard to believe we are halfway through the school year. I am very proud of the progress we have made thus far and very excited to share some of the district-level highlights. First, I'd like to introduce our recently hired employees: Tera Thompson (Treasurer's Assistant), Alyssa Finley and Casey Johnson (custodians), Tamara Louth



(cook), Sarah Burden (bus driver). We added a new position called TESOL (Teacher of English as a Secondary or Other Language). We welcome Mr. Dave Lenhart to this position. Mr. Lenhart is also one of our newly licensed substitute bus drivers. We now have several sub bus drivers, including myself. However, we are still looking to fill our preschool van driver position. One of our art teachers, Mrs. Amy Gratz, was recently recognized as being named the Ohio Department of Education VFW Grades 9-12 Teacher of the Year. We are very proud of Mrs. Gratz!

We were recently awarded several grants that include: \$45,000 School Bus Purchase, over \$180,000 in ESC mini grants (state funds), and a \$150,000 School Safety grant. Plans are underway for purchasing a new 84 passenger transit bus, much like the other route buses we are currently running. Numerous teachers have been working diligently to utilize the grant items or training they received from the mini grants. We are working on plans to upgrade our security system, including doors, cameras, alert/panic buttons, as well as handheld and transportation radios. A fence around the playground will be installed later this spring. Thank you to our community stakeholders for sharing input on these measures. I especially enjoyed the open conversations at our recent Senior Citizens Days. The next one is set for May 16th from 9:00-10:00 in the cafeteria.

Additional improvements we are working on around the district include upgrading our sound system in the cafetorium for musical performances, replacing the carpet in the wings with vinyl plank flooring, replacing tables in the cafetorium as well as furniture in several classrooms and staff workrooms, upgrading lighting at the football stadium, purchasing drumline instruments, and purchasing all new staff laptops. Of course, there are always unexpected projects like the fire damage in the administrative building gymnasium. We are expecting to reopen the gym very soon and are pleased with the work being done to replace the light, floor, and wrestling mats.

Our staff continue to pursue professional development to grow and expand opportunities for our students. Mr. Edinger recently took several MS teachers to a state level conference. Our Threat Assessment Team of 16 staff all have or will be attending a full day of safety training. On January 26th, all staff will learn strategies on how to work with students with English language challenges. Staff, like students, are continuously learning for personal and professional growth.

Lastly, I encourage everyone to support the Education Foundation. We have been making a strong effort to increase funds for student scholarships. Thank you to those who have chosen to create a scholarship in honor of a loved one. All scholarships are awarded to senior students who plan to continue their education after graduation.

Thank you for your continued support for the school and especially for our students. We have excellent staff, programs, and facilities. Let's continue to work together to put "students first" in all that we do!


