Dear New Brunswick Public Schools Community,

New Brunswick Public Schools commitment to suicide awareness and prevention continues to be at the forefront of our work. It is a continuous effort by all that requires vigilance and compassion throughout the year. Together, we can make a difference in the lives of every single one of our students and staff.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ranked suicide as the 14th leading cause of death in New Jersey and the third leading cause of death for ages 10 to 24. While New Jersey has a lower rate of suicide compared to the national average, we must continue to work collaboratively on proactively raising awareness for suicide behaviors.

NBPS recognizes the importance of identifying warning signs for suicide to prevent, intervene, and provide post-care for students who have considered or attempted suicide. As per NBPS Policy 5350 "The Board directs all school district staff members to be alert to a student who exhibits warning signs of self-destruction or who threatens or attempts suicide. Any such warning signs or the report of such warning signs from another student or staff member shall be taken with the utmost seriousness and reported immediately to the Principal or designee." It is the responsibility of <u>all</u> staff members to <u>immediately report</u> any student or staff that is indicating that they have suicidal ideation to a School Administrator, Social Worker, and/or School Nurse.
