How could we gather feedback from our community?

Hosted Feedback opportunities will be in a "World Cafe" format.

A World Café conversation is a structured group dialogue in which participants discuss a topic at small tables like those in a café. Participants rotate to different tables after each round, bringing their insights and learning from others. World Café conversations are designed to foster collaboration and knowledge sharing, and to generate new ideas and perspectives.

- 1. Clarify the Context
- 2. Create Hospitable Space
- 3. Explore Questions that Matter
- 4. Encourage Everyone's Contribution
- 5. Connect Diverse Perspectives
- 6. Listen together for Patterns and Insights

Proposed Change at Seward Montessori



Proposed Sixth Grade Plan for Seward

- Seward is currently the only Montessori school in the Minneapolis Public Schools.
- The Montessori philosophy, approach, and curriculum is designed in 3-year cycles. Currently, students miss out on the 3rd year of the final cycle and therefore are not able to receive the full benefits of the Montessori programming.
- Caregivers have shared their preference for completing the the final round of Montessori programming through the school's survey that was given both of the last two school years.
