Minimum Graduation Requirements

- 4 English
- 4 Math
- 4 Social Studies
- 4 Science
- 1.5 Physical Education
- .5 Health
- 2 Foreign Languages
- 1 Art
- 3 Electives

LEAP 2025 High School Assessment - *Students need at least one passing score in each of the three categories:*

English I or English II

Algebra I or Geometry

Biology or Social Studies (US History % '27, Civics % '28 and younger)

History of the Bac at LFNO

- 2011 - Important part or original charter and purpose of school
- 2018 - Started planning based on French American Baccalauréate (FAB)
- 2020 - High school accreditation paused due to French Ministry of Education (MEN) and AEFÉ shifts away from FAB and OIB to create a new international Bac
- 2022-2023 - Accreditation of full high school, finalized summer 2023
- April 2023-January 2024 - Beginning stages of Baccalauréat Français International (BFI)
- 2023-2024 School Year - cohort of 11th graders switch to BFI program and all 10th graders and below take prep courses for BFI

Baccalauréat Français International (BFI)

- 74 schools around the world transitioned from OIB to BFI for the first time in the 2022-2023 school year
- 36 schools around the world are rolling out the BFI for the 2023-2024 school year
- LFNO is the only school that has been given permission to concurrently run a BFI program while completing the application process, due to our high level of preparation
- MEN regards this as the ideal Bac, and will develop BFI programs in France where resources are available
- AEFÉ's goal is for all French international schools to eventually become BFI programs

Baccalauréat Français International (BFI) at LFNO

Unparalleled Educational Opportunity:

- Highly regarded diplomas
 - TOPS, Louisiana college preparatory diploma
 - BFI is seen as best baccalauréate in France
- Agreement between American College Board and French Ministry of Education (MEN):
- Specific AP courses and exams replace some traditional Bac courses and exams
- Enriched curriculum and balanced instruction in English and French
- Strong academic transcripts, very attractive for college acceptance

For the class of 2026 (current 9th graders) and younger students:

- All students pk-9 continue their course of study, as it has always been preparation for the BFI
- All students in 10th-12th grades will complete the BFI coursework, working towards earning both the TOPS Louisiana Diploma and the BFI Diploma
