

Sanctuary Task Force Bylaws

WHAT ARE BYLAWS?

Bylaws are the written rules that control the internal affairs of a group of people or organization.

Bylaws generally define things like the group's official name, purpose, requirements for membership, responsibilities, how meetings should be conducted, and how often meetings will be held.

WHY SHOULD WE HAVE BYLAWS?

- Define our mission or goals
- Define how the Sanctuary is going to operate, keeping things running smoothly
- Save us time and make our work more productive and effective





Sanctuary Task Force's Mission

- Propose school protocols and systems responding to the needs of immigrant students and families.
- Support school sites in establishing and nurturing a welcoming and inclusive culture where immigrant students and their families feel valued and supported.
- Enhance partnerships with community-based organizations and legal organizations who provide resources & services for immigrant families.
