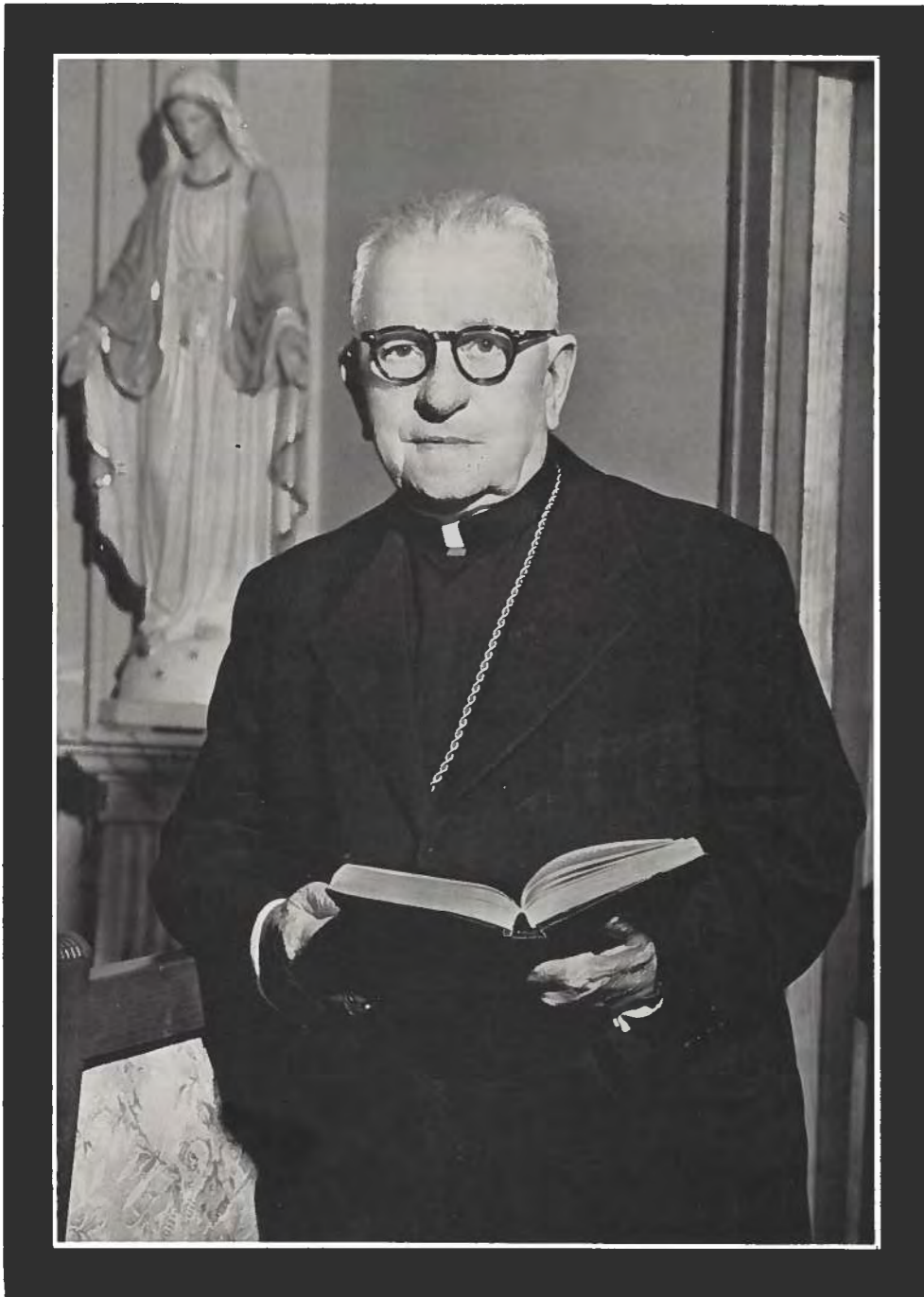

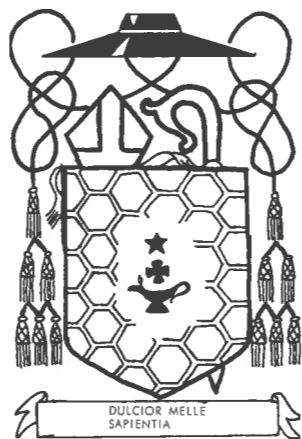

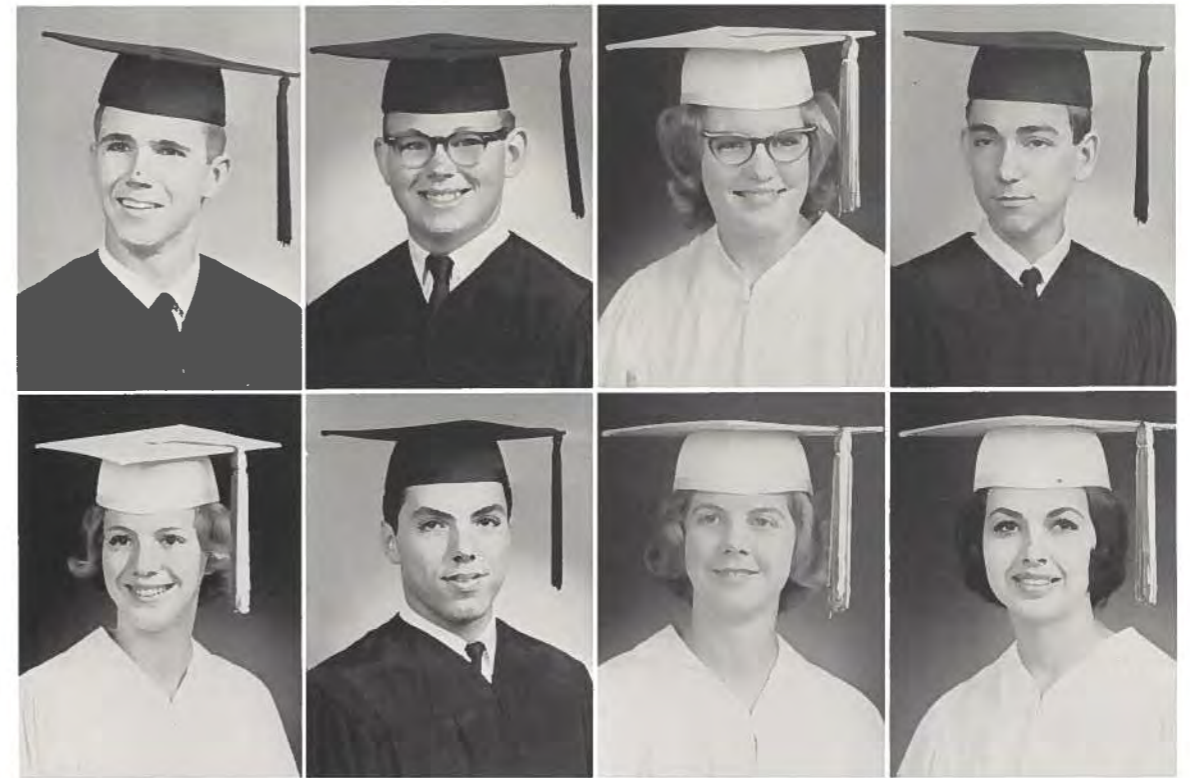

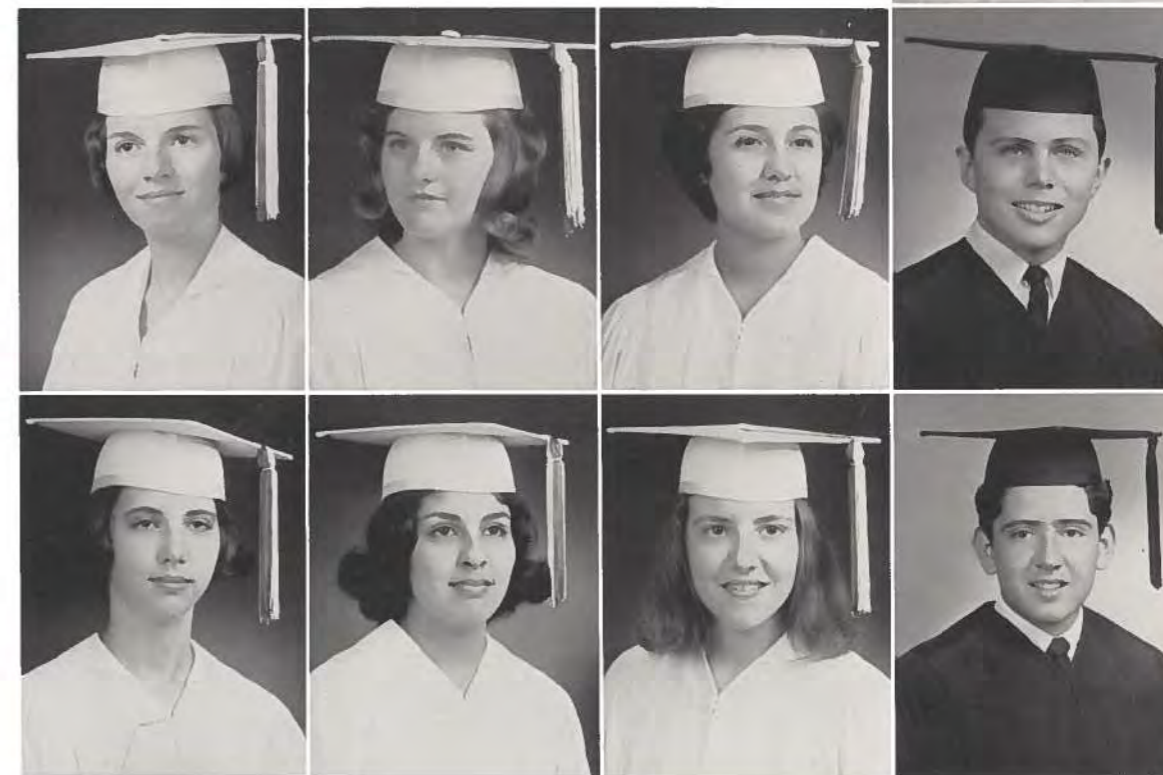

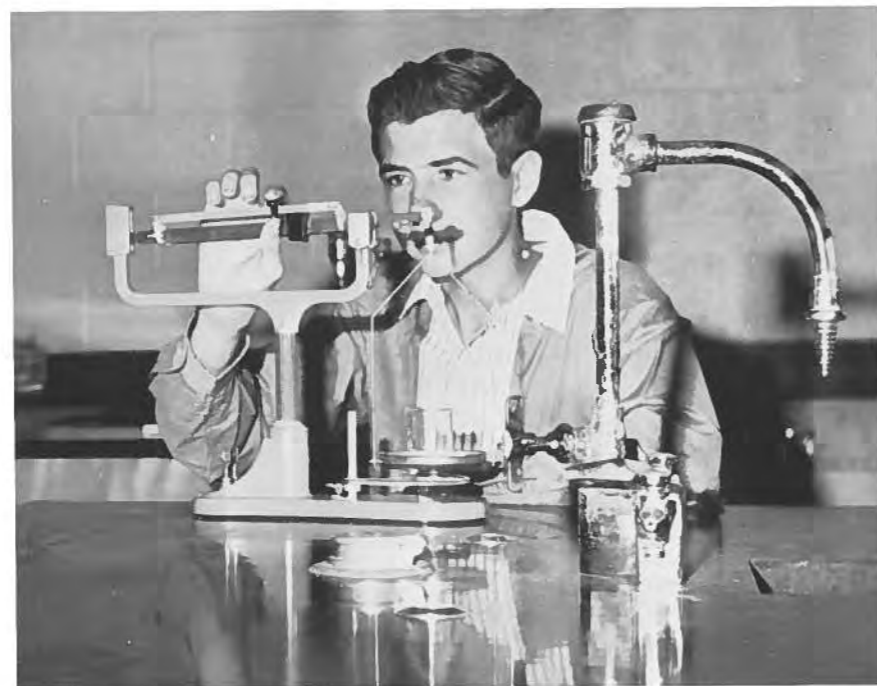

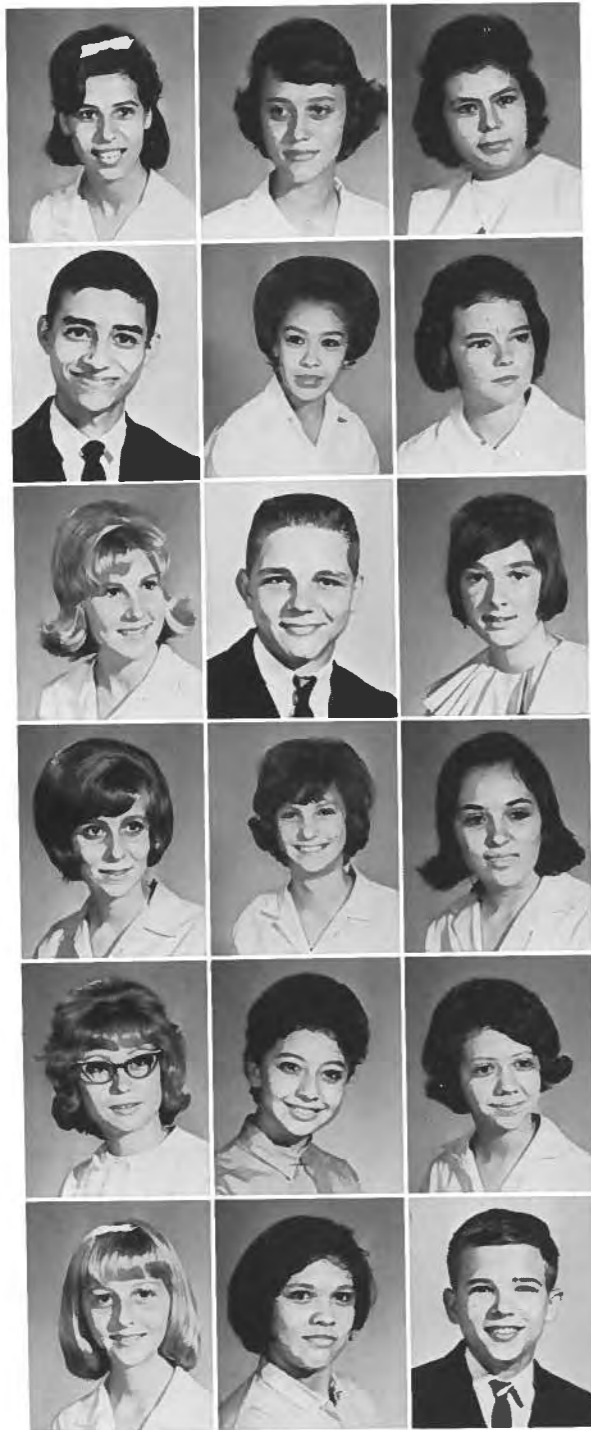

A short CCD member, Barbara Netek, fills a tall holy water fountain. The CCD sees that the fountains in every room are kept filled.

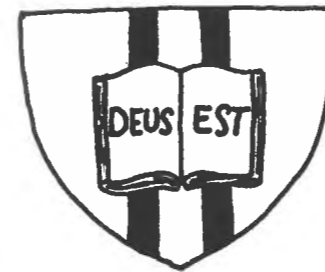

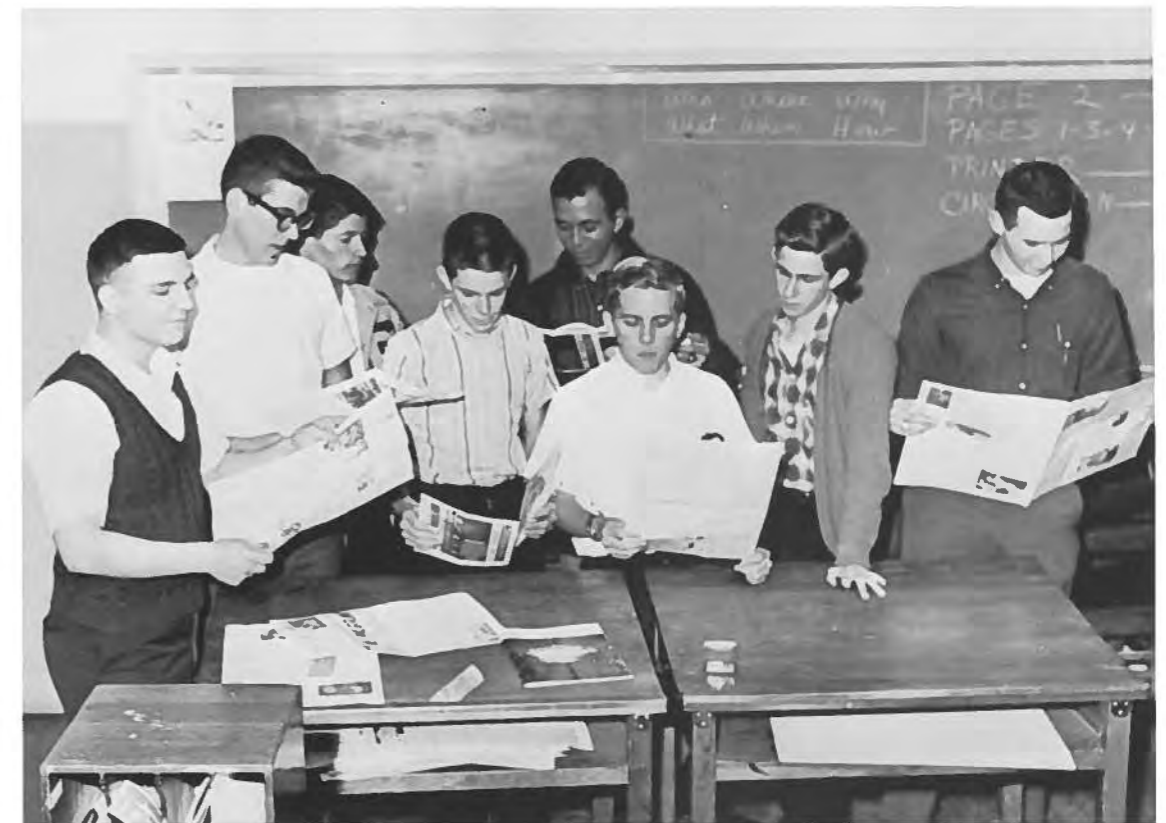

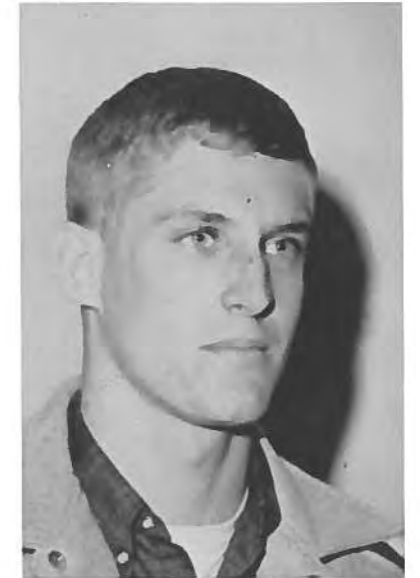

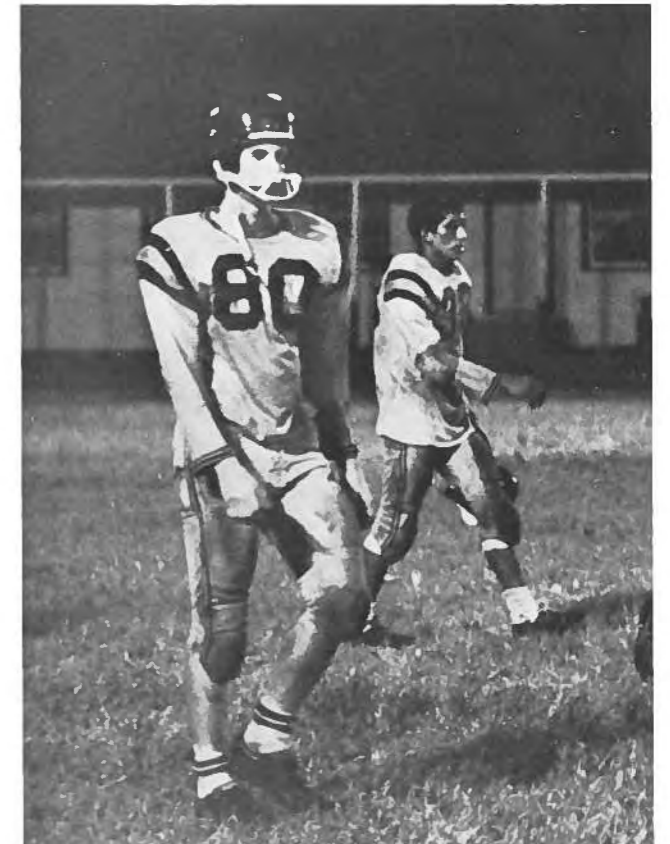

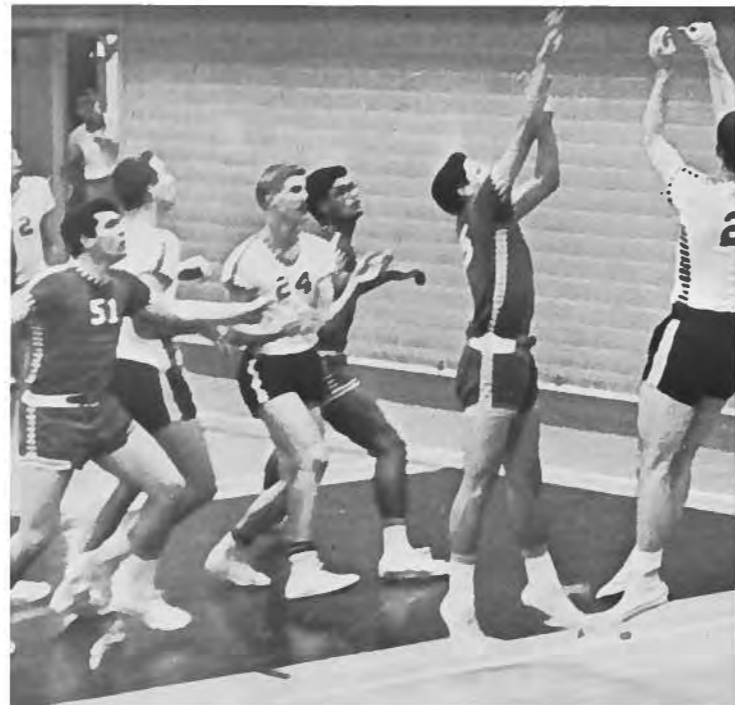

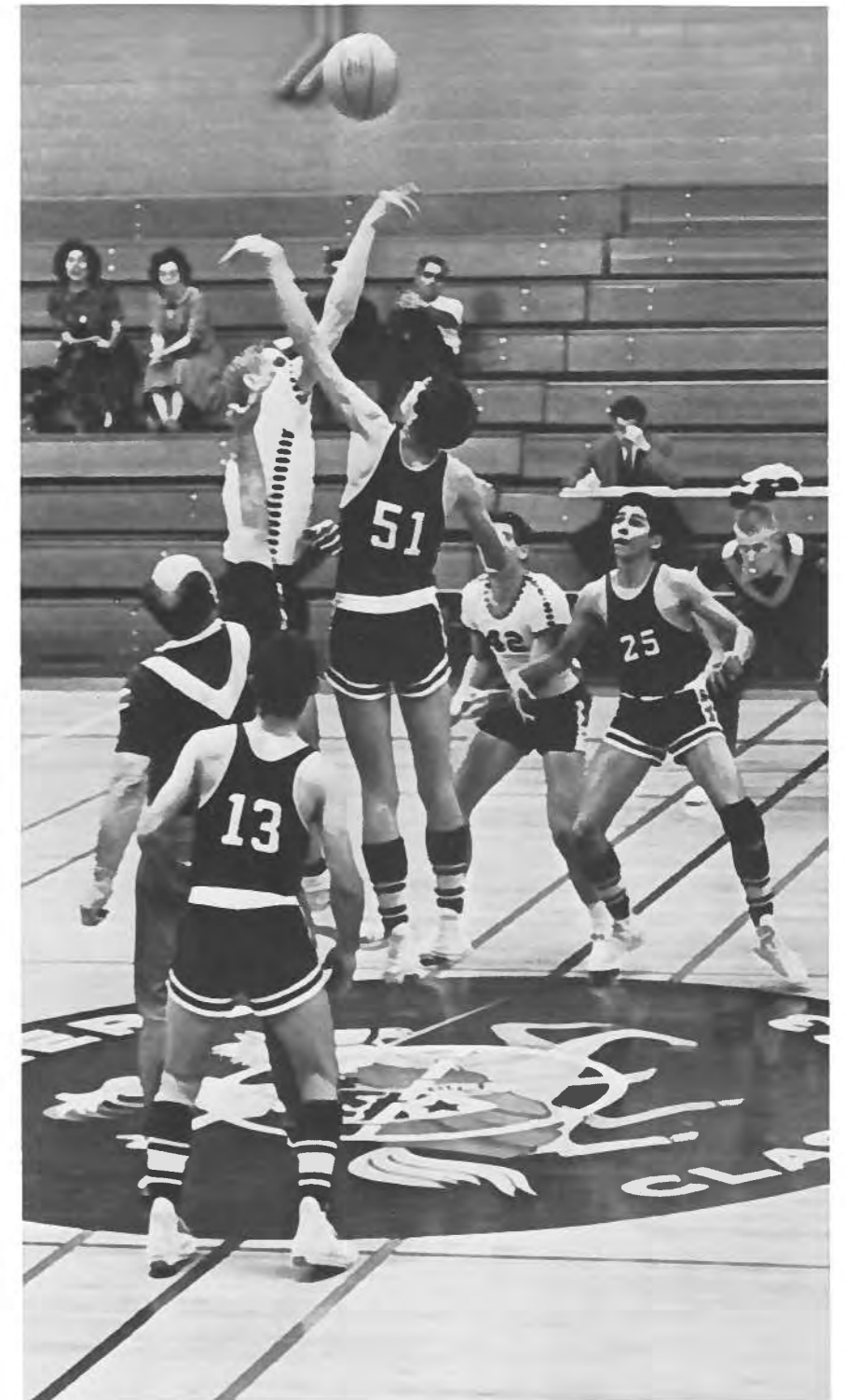

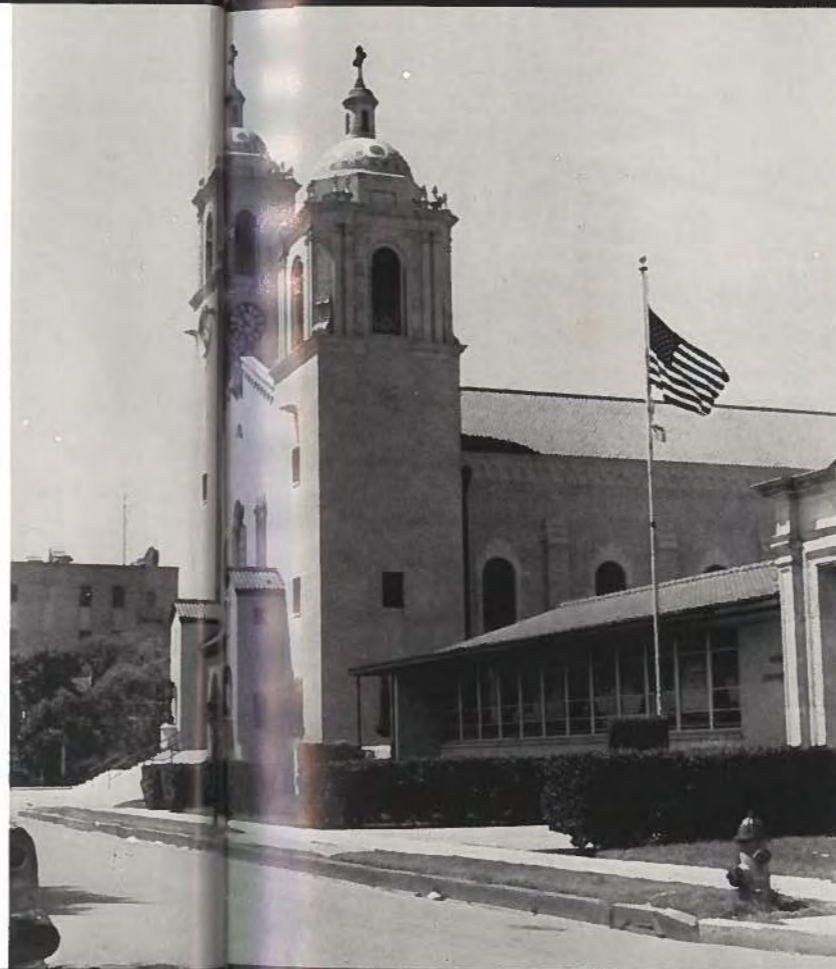
