FINANCIAL AID

COVID brought about many changes and some are here to stay. The Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority (MEFA) Representatives, who would attend high schools in person to meet with parents about Financial Aid, have decided to stick with the virtual format. This allows students and families to access the information at their own convenience. Webinars cover a range of topics related to college planning and financial aid. Presenters will include MEFA staff members as well as guests from financial aid offices across the Commonwealth, providing families the opportunity to hear from many of the most knowledgeable financial aid leaders in the industry. PSATs ON WEDNESDAY 10/13

Students are invited to take the PSATs at Tahanto on Wednesday morning, October 13, 2021. Due to space limitations, Juniors will be given priority. If seating is available, registered sophomores may be allowed to test. Registration Forms and an \$18 payment are due to the Counseling Office Friday, September 10. Depending upon mandates at that time, students may be required to wear masks throughout the test. No food or drink will be allowed in the testing rooms. Questions about the test and concerns about payment may be directed to Ms. Rodman.



Due to the challenges that the pandemic, along with many natural disasters, have brought to the standardized testing schedule, many colleges are continuing with their policy to go "test optional" for the current application cycle. If this is the case for a particular school, no student will be penalized for failure to submit scores as part of their application process. Colleges have waived this requirement, have a moratorium on it for the next several years, and many have done away with them altogether. See the list of schools here.
