

Understanding IBMYP PATHWAYS



There are 3 pathways to being a part of the IB Middle Years Program here at MLHS. Students who take 2 or more IBMYP courses are considered IB students. The goal is that every student has access to the IB philosophy and academic excellence that comes with being a part of such a program. We encourage all students to challenge themselves with rigorous coursework, and these 3 pathways ensure flexibility for all to accomplish this goal at their own pace.

FULL CERTIFICATE

- 6 IBMYP Subjects in grade 10
- 28 points minimum - (no subject scores below 3 - 2 or below will disqualify a student)
- Completed 40 hours of Service in Action of 2 years
- Complete the Personal Project and receive a passing mark from IBO

ASSOCIATE CERTIFICATE

- 5 IBMYP Subjects in grade 10 - frees up one period for CTE, ASB, or other course.
- 24 points minimum - (no subject scores below 3 - 2 or below will disqualify a student)
- Completed 40 hours of Service in Action of 2 years
- Complete the Personal Project and receive a passing mark from IBO

IBMYP AMBASSADOR

Traditionally, these are students who are looking to challenge themselves in a few areas, but not across the board:

- 2-4 IBMYP Courses - at least 1 course must be IBMYP HONORS US HISTORY or IBMYP5 ENGLISH during 10th grade.
- 3 points minimum in each course
- Personal Project and Service in Action is an "opt-in" aspect. Students are expected to meet with the IBMYP Coordinator to review their unique position within this category.

It is IMPORTANT to note that some students may join the program during the 10th grade, and they should meet with the IBMYP Coordinator to review the program and their expectations along with meeting with their campus counselor to select a schedule.
