

Family Communication

Communication is key! It is important that your child's teacher and the school be able to communicate with you. In order for us to do so, we will need to have the most current information available for the following:



Please make sure to contact the Front Office at (408) 283-6375 if there are any changes to the above information. It is important to have a current working phone number on file in case of emergency.

When outreaching to your child's teacher, please allow two school days for teachers to respond. Please note that teachers will be unable to respond during instructional time.

Franklin Elementary School and teachers will be using an application called ParentSquare to communicate with families on a regular basis. All school announcements and weekly newsletters will be sent through ParentSquare. We ask that families download the application onto your phone to stay connected with your child's teacher and the school. You can also sign up for ParentSquare at: https://www.parentsquare.com/join_school/new.



Our school website will be regularly updated. For the latest information, families can always visit our school website at <u>franklin.fmsd.org</u>.

To provide feedback to the school, we will be sending out periodic surveys for families and students to respond to. We thank you in advance for responding. Surveys will be sent out via ParentSquare.

Family Guidelines

We look forward to working in close partnership with the families and students we serve. We know that now, more than ever, we will need to work together to help our students thrive.

In order to help families as their students engage in school, we suggest families follow these guidelines:

- ★ Establish a routine at home to support learning (ie. have a regular bedtime and wake-up time).
- ★ Check online communication daily to keep up to date on assignments or notifications.
 - Talk to your student's teacher about how you prefer to communicate.
 - If needed, ask for help accessing communication through ParentSquare.
- ★ Make sure your student is completing their assignments with integrity and academic honesty (Students should always turn in assignments that have their own thoughts and work).
- ★ Ask teachers, school staff, or others if you need help.
 - Teachers and school staff want to know your questions and concerns.
 - If you think your child may be depressed, anxious, stressed, or in need of wellness services (i.e., counseling), or if your family has basic needs (e.g., housing, legal services, food, etc.), please reach out to your teacher or the front office.

Parent-Teacher Conferences

Parent-Teacher conferences are held two times per year. It is the expectation that all parents will attend conferences to learn about if their child is meeting grade-level standards or not.

Visiting School

When families come on the Franklin campus, parents/guardians and guests must report to the office first. If you wish to visit a classroom, please contact the teacher ahead of time to schedule a mutually-convenient time. Please sign in at the office and obtain a visitor's badge.



Attendance

Consistent attendance is one of the most important factors in students' academic success. Students are expected to come to school every day, but if your student is not able to attend school, please inform both your student's teacher and our front office (408) 283-6375, or daysi.barraza@fmsd.org. Our secretary will note the reason for absence. The office is equipped with a 24-hour voicemail answering system. When calling about your child's absence, please provide the following information:

- Student's name and date of absence.
- Reason for absence (illness, family emergency, medical appointments, etc).
- Relationship of caller to student (parent, guardian, etc).

Important Note: If your child is absent three days or more, the school requires a doctor's note upon your child's return.

For students with frequent absences, state law [ED Code, Sec 43504f] requires that school districts have written procedures for tiered reengagement strategies. Franklin Elementary School and the Franklin-McKinley School District will seek to communicate the importance of attendance to families and help families find solutions and connect them with resources that can reduce absenteeism.

Uniform Policy

Franklin school has a Uniform Dress Code. All students are expected to dress in the following manner:

- White or forest green shirt/blouses with a collar.
- Franklin t-shirts or sweatshirts.
- Khaki long or short pants.
- Khaki colored skirts and jumpers.
- Plaid skirts and jumpers (green and blue).

Shorts and skirts must be fingertip length when the arm is down at the side. We encourage students to wear jackets, sweaters, and sweatshirts in white, khaki, tan, black, or forest green.



Student Behavior Expectations

In order to help students and their classmates make the most of their learning time, we have the following expectations for all students.

★ Be Respectful

- Use school language.
- Smile when greeting your teacher and classmates. Be polite and respectful to everyone.
- Maintain eye-contact.
- Enjoy learning and working together.
- Respect school and personal property.

★ Be Responsible

- Refrain from eating, drinking, or chewing gum during live lessons.
- Be ready with all past work done.
- Obey all directions of adults at Franklin.
- Be helpful and responsible.

★ Be Safe

- Never share/post your account information online.
- Use the bathroom in a safe and clean way.
- Walk at school. Running is only allowed on the turf or grass.

Bullying and All Forms of Harassment

Bullying and all forms of harassment are illegal and not tolerated on the school campus and during extracurricular activities. Disciplinary action will be taken by the school's administration to deter bullying of students and all forms of harassment. This may include, but is not limited to, community circles, home suspensions and expulsion recommendations.

Guidelines for Violation of School Rules

When a student violates a school rule, the student will receive a consequence and parents will be notified. Consequences may include counseling with an adult, participation in a community circle, community service, recess or lunch detention, completing a behavior reflection, or any other appropriate action. A teacher may suspend a student from the classroom, but not from school, for up to two days. The principal may suspend a student from the classroom or the school. When a student is suspended from school, an effort will be made to contact the parents by phone. A Notice of Suspension is also given to the parent/guardian during a conference with the principal or school designee.



Zero Tolerance

Franklin Elementary has zero tolerance for the following:

- No student may have in his/her possession a knife, gun, sharp object, or other dangerous object(s).
- No student may brandish a weapon.
- No student may have in his/her possession, use or sell, a controlled substance(s) or drug(s).
- No student may assault or harass another student.

Any student, regardless of age, who commits one or more of these offenses will be suspended and could be recommended for expulsion.
