ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Class Schedule: The school calendar is divided into two semesters. We do use a hybrid block schedule.

Advanced Placement: Eureka offers twenty-five courses through the College Board Advanced Placement program. Students may begin taking AP courses in their sophomore year. Advanced Credit: Certain courses offered may be taken for college credit. College credit is awarded through the University of Missouri - St. Louis.

Dual Enrollment: Approved students may take courses not available at Eureka at local universities during the regular school day. These courses may apply toward the students' graduation requirements.

Honors and Accelerated Classes: Certain courses are offered with honors or acceleration.

Grade Point Calculation: Gpa is based on grades earned in years 9-12. **We have eliminated class rank beginning with the Class of 2013.** All courses for which the student receives a grade are included in gpa. GPA is based on a 4.0 scale with an "A" worth 4 points.

COVID – 19 UPDATE

2019-2020 School Year

On March 23rd, 2020, the Rockwood School District began the Alternative Learning Plan (virtual instruction), which ran until the end of the school year. The District adopted a Hold Harmless policy – grades could not be lowered from where they were as of March 12, 2020, the last day before Spring Break. Students' grades could be improved, however, through student effort, participation, and ALP assignments. In addition, final exams were not given for the spring semester.

2020-2021 School Year

The Rockwood School District began the 2020-2021 school year on August 24th in a virtual setting. For the first semester, classes are split into quarters, with 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th hour classes occurring during 1st Quarter (Aug. 24 – Oct. 23) and 2nd, 4th, and 6th hour classes occurring during 2nd Quarter (Oct. 27 - Jan 14th). Grades from the first quarter will not be posted on the transcript until the completion of second quarter classes. Students returned to in-person learning second semester.
