Superintendent's Report March 16, 2023 Board Meeting

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Curriculum and Instruction, Mr. Garner Ezell

- The following state assessments have been administered in Athens City Schools during the second semester.
 - o ACCESS for ELLs: January 30 March 17
 - o Alternate ACCESS for ELLs: January 30 March 17
 - o ACAP Alternate: March 1 April 7
 - o ACT with Writing: March 14
- The ACS Textbook Committee is currently reviewing K-3 Comprehensive English Language Arts (ELA) series that can be used as instructional resources in building units of study and designing learning experiences for students.
- District math and ELA teams are doing excellent work in developing a K-12 Numeracy Plan
 and a K-12 Literacy Plan respectively for Athens City Schools. These teams will continue their
 work during summer 2023.
- Athens City Schools will host its annual Job Fair on March 20.
- Approximately **75 ACS elementary teachers** are participating in **LETRS** (*Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling*) training. LETRS training is based on the science of reading. It can take upwards of 160 hours to complete over the course of two years. **45 ACS** elementary teachers will complete their two-year commitment in April 2023.
- The District MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Supports) Team has been meeting on a monthly basis since November 2022. The focus of the work has been in grades 4-8 and will expand to other grades in the future. The team has been analyzing data, completing an initiative inventory, reviewing communication tools, and developing a common academic language for the district. The team also examined data from a recent MTSS survey that was distributed to employees, students, parents, and community members.
- **Summer Learning Camp** is scheduled for the month of June for eligible students in grades K-5. The camp will be held at iAcademy @ Athens Elementary School and will include both reading and math intervention activities.
- 46 ACS educators will be attending **AVID Summer Institute** in Tampa, Florida on June 18-21 to learn more about writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR) strategies that can be used in classrooms to help close the opportunity gap.
- ACS administrators will be participating in Learning Walks at iAcademy @ Athens Elementary School on March 21. The learning walk process is focused on the tasks that students are working on in the classroom. Administrators will be leading teachers on learning walks in their schools during April and May.
- The following Cognia surveys have been administered in Athens City Schools. The data collected will be analyzed and used for strategic planning.
