Job Description:

The MYP Maths Teacher is responsible for fostering a passion for Mathematics in our students and for working collaboratively with members of all subject teams to develop engaging and inspirational learning experiences. The successful candidate will be expected to teach MYP Maths Grades 6, 7 and 9, working with students with a diverse range of talent and ability.

The preferred candidate will:

- Have knowledge of, and experience with, the educational philosophies, assessment requirements and practices of the International Baccalaureate, specifically relating to the Middle Years Programmes (preferred)
- Have work experience with students ages 11-15 years
- Have a high level of English Proficiency
- Have the ability to plan, deliver and reflect on curriculum and lessons which will stimulate, motivate and engage students' learning and agency
- Have the ability to teach to ensure inclusion through universal design and differentiated instruction
- Be capable of instilling confidence and facilitate students' understanding and application of mathematical concepts
- Have the ability to work collaboratively with teachers, students, parents, and administrators
- Have strong organizational, leadership, and communication skills
- Be organized and reliable
- Engage actively and enthusiastically to contribute to a positive school environment

Requirements:

- Have a Bachelor's degree in Education; or a related field (Master's degree preferred); or multi-subject teaching credential
- Have teaching experience, preferably in an IB school or with IB programs
- Have a minimum of 3 years of experience successfully teaching math in middle school
