



High-quality instructional staff and learning programs are provided to ensure young learners are afforded the opportunity to develop a foundation of academic and social skills.

By providing a strong foundation in the earliest years of their lives, Simi Valley Unified School District believes children have a greater opportunity for success in school and beyond From Here to Anywhere!

How to Prepare for the First Days of School

Students are encouraged to practice appropriate independent skills needed at school:

Managing clothing:

- Practice fastening buttons and using zippers.
- Putting on and taking off jackets, sweaters, sweatshirts, etc.
- Shoes

Using the restroom:

- Students use the restroom independently while at school. (ie washing hands, clothing, etc)
- Your teacher will usually ask for you to send an extra set of clothing as accidents of all kinds do happen.

Accessing supplies & personal items:

 Practice using crayons/scissors/glue as well as opening/closing food containers, water bottles, & backpacks.



TK Eligibility & Enrollment Process

2023-2024 CURRENT TK ENROLLMENT

- Opened to all students who turned 4-years-old by September 1, 2023
- 620 students placed
- Total of 27 classes located on 16 of our 18 elementary schools
- Three classes at Justin Early Learners Academy
- Two classes on eight of the elementary campuses
- Each class staffed with a certificated teacher and a paraprofessional



When is your child's birthday?

On or before September 1, 2019



Your child is eligible for Kindergarten July 1, 2019 -September 1, 2019



Your child is eligible for Kindergarten

OR

Your child is eligible for Deferred Kindergarten enrollment and can apply for Transitional Kindergarten* September 2, 2019 -September 1, 2020



Your child is eligible for Transitional Kindergarten on a space available basis

*cannot have previously participated in TK

2024-2025 TK ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

- Open to all students turning 4-years-old by September 1, 2024
- The enrollment process is handled by the District Office, NOT at the school sites
- Enrollment packets will be available from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily starting on January 8, 2024
- TK enrollment is NOT part of the School of Choice process
- Class locations are determined by demand and the availability of facilities
- Neighborhood schools and elementary sibling enrollment are considerations but not guarantees for placement priority
- As demand and capacity increases, additional TK classes could be established

TK packets MUST be complete to submit and become eligible for placement.

REQUIRED documents include:

- ☐ Enrollment Form (found in the Enrollment Packet)
- Clear copy of an original certified Birth Certificate
- ☐ Copy of your proof of Simi Valley Residency (utility bill, lease agreement, mortgage deed)
- Copy of your child's immunization records (information on next slide)



REQUIRED immunizations include:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap, or Td): 5 doses (4 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday. 3 doses OK if one was given on or after 7th birthday.)
- □ Polio (OPV or IPV): 4 doses (3 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday)
- □ Hepatitis B: 3 doses
- □ Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR): 2 doses (Both given on or after 1st birthday)
- □ Varicella (Chickenpox): 2 doses
- These immunization requirements apply to new admissions and transfers for all grades, including UTK.

*STUDENTS MAY NOT ATTEND THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL UNTIL ALL IMMUNIZATIONS ARE CURRENT. ATTENDANCE WILL BE DENIED.



TK Immunization Requirements

Priority Enrollment

- Priority enrollment is open until March 22, 2024.
- Priority enrollment provides families with the best opportunity to be placed at their neighborhood or sibling attended school.
 However, class size and classroom space will determine enrollment capacity.
- Enrollment received after March 22, 2024 will be placed based on availability of space remaining.



The Dual Language Academy at Arroyo Elementary School

Dual Language Immersion (DLI)

SVUSD will open its 1st DLI program at Arroyo Elementary in the 2024-2025 school year

Two-way dual immersion is language learning and academic instruction for native speakers of English and native speakers of another language. The goal of a DLI program is proficiency and academic achievement in both languages as well as cross-cultural understanding.

We will begin forming classes in April. You will receive a confirmation of your child's placement at a school site.




