Communications

Superintendent's Report: Dr. Finneran shared highlights of the LUSD Staff Development Day on October 27. The day was split between time learning in smaller content specific groups and large group learning focused on cultural proficiency and teaching with a sensitivity to student's individual experiences in mind. It was a very productive day. She also shared pictures of the Diá de los Muertos event held at Lompoc High and Miguelito's Family Reading Night. The Family Reading Night featured readings by community members including a police officer and fire fighter. Dr. Finneran concluded with a reminder of the areas of focus and thanking all staff as we continue to work together for the students of LUSD.

Board Member Reports: The Board members were busy throughout the District since the last board meeting. Several attended the CHS Sharktober Fest at the aquarium and Evening of the Arts. The LVMS Fall Carnival and the Dia de los Muertos event held at Lompoc High School were also among events board members attended. Members also participated on the Superintendent's Committees on Academic Achievement and Student Behavior.

The Board approved 7 consent items including:

Reports

Mission Valley Single Plan for Student Success: Principal Eric Trigueiro presented the report. Information on Mission Valley's demographics academic performance, absenteeism and discipline rates were shared. This data was used to create the school goals which are to open college and career pathways, achievement in both ELA and Math will increase for all students, including ELL students and those with chronic absenteeism, as evidenced by LUSD District Common Formative Assessments, and through SBAC results for grades 3-8.

<u>Dr. Bob Forinash Community Day School Single Plan for Student Achievement</u>: Principal Eric Trigueiro presented the report. Information on BFCDS's demographics, conditions and climate, absenteeism and discipline rates were shared. This data was used to determine four focus areas, social emotional well-being, academic rigor, PBIS staff training and inclusion of students. Focusing on these areas will support achieving the goals of improved student engagement, school culture/climate, academic rigor and the mentality of the students shifting towards a growth mindset.

Classified Personnel Report: The report was presented by Lacy Gillespie, Classified Personnel Director. There are 85 current vacancies with nine (9) employees ready to start, and 20 employees working out of class. Since May of 2022, 149 employees have been hired into the District, 102 employees have separated from the District and 137 employees have been reassigned within the District. Mr. Gillespie reported that the department is currently working with the SBCEO Associate Superintendent of HR to analyze their structure and operation to see where processes can be streamlined or expedited.

Hapgood Emergency Status Update: The report was presented by Doug Sorum, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services. This report is an update on the repairs to the structural damage caused by the fire on the Hapgood campus last April. The Department of the State Architect (DSA) stamped plans and project manual were received on October 30. Framing began a week later and is expected to take two weeks. Plaster and roof work will follow.
