Willis ISD's Roark Early Education Center has recently been named a Model Professional Learning Community at Work. The facility is one of about 500 schools and districts in the US and Canada to receive this honor.

The school's successful implementation of the Professional Learning Communities at Work process was a major contributing factor in the improved achievement of its students.

Responding to news of the recognition, Principal Calandra Lewis said, "We are honored to receive this recognition. Our mission at Roark is to set the foundation of learning by developing social/emotional, and academic skills for ALL students. Our teachers have been committed and intentional in working collaboratively to grow our district's youngest students. When our students leave us, they are not only Kindergarten ready, but they are ready to be successful in all future learning."

Schools are recognized based on strict criteria, including demonstration of a commitment to PLC concepts, implementation of these concepts for at least three years and clear evidence of improved student learning over that period. Once measurable results can be seen, the school must explain its practices, structures, and culture and submit its application for consideration by the PLC Review Committee.

### Willis ISD officers attend safety trainings

Willis ISD officers recently attended ALERRT (Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training) and AAIR (Active Attack Incident Response) with the Sheriff's Department. These trainings are designed to improve integration between law enforcement, fire, telecommunications and emergency medical services (EMS) in active attack/shooter events.

The course provides law enforcement officers with key medical skills which can be used at the point of injury (POI) to increase the survivability of victims. The course also provides a model framework for law enforcement, fire and EMS to integrate responses during an active attack/shooter.

Additionally, officers attended Red Dot sight training. Red Dot optics have become increasingly common due to advantages such as being able to place the dot on the threat and keep focus on the threat versus the sight. Many law enforcement officers are switching to handguns with red dot sights (RDS), so practice with the system is imperative.
