
A WORD FROM OUR Superintendent

On Wednesday, September 20, the Board of Trustees held a regularly scheduled board meeting.

Before convening into closed session, the Board listened to a presentation by superintendent search firm N2 Learning. Trustees will hear one more presentation in October before deciding on a search firm. Once a firm is selected, the Board will work with the company to develop a search plan and timeline.

Lagway Elementary students Brock Stranimier, Katie Mansfield and Sophia Hamby led the pledges and prayers before the presentation of the district's Elementary Student of the Month. Sofia Trujillo, a first grader at Lagway Elementary, was nominated by her teacher Rachel Wilson.

"Sofia is a model student. She lives out our school pledge every day. She comes to school to learn. She works hard, she does her best, she's a leader and a great friend." Wilson said.

After naming the elementary representative, Brabham Middle School recognized the district's Secondary Student of the Month, eighth grader Daniel McBride.





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
