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Willis Wildkats end historic season at Alamodome












Willis HS Cheer competes at UDA Competition




Willis HS CTE students simulate Shark Tank for project








Willis HS student earns first chair at TMEA Region Orchestra Auditions




Meador Elementary hosts CTE Expo

Willis ISD November Board Meeting Recap

On Wednesday, November 8, the Board of Trustees held a public hearing regarding an increase in compensation for the current high school football coach, along with a regularly scheduled board meeting.

During the public meeting, the Board discussed the impact of the head football coach of Willis High School. Several parents and colleagues spoke about the coach's dedication to the team and the community. There was discussion on the impact of his success in this position and its significance on the morale of the community as a whole.

The board then officially called the regular meeting to order, opening the floor to general public comments. When this concluded, the board convened into a closed session to discuss matters on the agenda.

Once the board reconvened in open session, A.R. Turner Elementary students Jack Dugas and Lilli Harrison led the pledges and prayer before presenting the district's Elementary Student of the Month, A.R. Turner, fifth-grader Kylee Keith.

"This young lady is described by her teachers as hardworking, dedicated, and a friend to all. She displays a positive attitude in the face of challenges and always gives her best effort, no matter the task. She is kind and helpful to those around her," said Dr. Michelle Hall, Principal of A.R. Turner Elementary.

After naming the elementary representative, Willis High School recognized the district's Secondary Student of the Month, 12th grader Akeyah Gardin.

"She is a hard worker and is very attentive. She is a varsity cheer captain and a member of the National Honor Society. She is very organized, punctual, polite, and respectful. She is a strong leader who leads with passion, kindness, and positivity. Another teacher described this student of the month as one of the most delightful and charming students she has had in her 20-year teaching career," Principal of Willis High School, Eric King, shared.

Highlights from this month's meeting include the unanimous approval of a mid-year salary increase for the current head football coach at Willis High School and a presentation of the Bilingual/ESL Program Evaluation Report by Frida Bond, the district's bilingual coordinator. The board also approved the reclassification of a position in the district, flooring and paint upgrades for A.R. Turner from Bond 2020, and the travel of the mentoring coordinators to Washington for the National Mentoring Annual Summit. The board tabled the presentation by TIPS (The Interlocal Purchasing System).

The next regularly scheduled board meeting will be at the Willis High School PAC on December 13, 2023, at 5:30 PM.

Proposition B at \$62,565,000 for a Football Stadium & Community Room, and Proposition C at \$19,390,000 for a Natatorium were both rejected by voters.

A Long-Range Facilities Planning committee has been meeting twice a month since August to discuss current and future district needs, and to consider the need to recommend a bond issue to the school board for a future vote.



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


