- 1. ESTABLISH A CONSISTENT ROUTINE: ENCOURAGE YOUR STUDENT TO ESTABLISH A REGULAR ROUTINE FOR HOMEWORK, STUDYING, AND BEDTIME. CONSISTENCY CAN HELP CREATE A SENSE OF STABILITY AND IMPROVE FOCUS.
- 2. CREATE A DESIGNATED STUDY SPACE: SET UP A QUIET, WELL-LIT AREA IN YOUR HOME WHERE YOUR STUDENT CAN STUDY AND COMPLETE HOMEWORK WITHOUT DISTRACTIONS.
- 3. ENCOURAGE REGULAR COMMUNICATION: STAY IN TOUCH WITH YOUR STUDENT'S TEACHERS TO STAY UPDATED ON THEIR PROGRESS, AND ENCOURAGE OPEN COMMUNICATION BETWEEN YOU, YOUR STUDENT, AND THEIR EDUCATORS.
- 4. SUPPORT HEALTHY HABITS: ENCOURAGE HEALTHY EATING, REGULAR EXERCISE, AND ADEQUATE SLEEP TO HELP YOUR STUDENT STAY FOCUSED AND ENERGIZED THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL DAY.
