

Course Credit for the Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy at Public Colleges and Universities in Illinois

Per Illinois state [statute](#), “Each public community college and public university in this State shall establish criteria to translate a State Seal of Biliteracy into course credit based on foreign language course equivalencies identified by the community college's or university's faculty and staff and, upon request from an enrolled student, **the community college or university shall award foreign language course credit to a student who has received a State Seal of Biliteracy.** Students enrolled in a public community college or public university who have received a State Seal of Biliteracy must request course credit for their seal within 3 academic years after graduating from high school.”

While the legislation requires that schools translate the Seal into course credit, many schools also use the Seal as a placement tool or to satisfy certain graduation requirements. It is the student’s responsibility to seek these credits and approvals in a timely manner at the institution of higher education.
