## **Eagle News: District Annual Performance Report**

This time of the year, school districts receive their district Annual Performance Report (APR) from the Missouri Department of Elementary Secondary Education. The Missouri Department of Education has a set of criteria that they use to determine the level of accreditation for each school district in Missouri. The set of criteria is termed MSIP, and we are now working to meet the standards as determined by MSIP 5. The MSIP 5 Standards have been in place for four years now. That being said, the standardized tests that have been

used as one of the areas of measure is still being developed which means the standardized tests that students have been taking the past four years have not been consistent.

The Holden R-III School District has worked to continually improve to meet the district's goal of reaching 90% on the APR. We are proud to say that over the past four years we have continued to improve as the district has worked to meet the new tougher, more rigorous standards. This year, the district earned a 90.7% which continues a four-year consecutive improvement

and is up from 89.6% in 2015. This says a great deal about the students, faculty and staff in the Holden R-III School District as they work to continually improve to be the best they can be.

## Holden R-III Named an America's Farmers Grow Rural Education Grant Winner

The Holden R-III School District has been chosen to receive an America's Farmers Grow Rural Education grant for \$10,000, which will be used to enhance our S.T.E.A.M (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) programs at the elementary and middle school. Many thanks to our librarians, administrators, and science, technology, and art teachers who are working together to create new makerspaces in our libraries for our students, and to the local farmers who supported our application.

The grant will fund the purchase of two 3D printers, WeDo Lego Robotics, Little Bits electronic building blocks, and Makey Makey electronic circuit boards. Working with these innovative tools will ignite our students' desire to learn while enhancing their skills in science, engineering, technology, and coding. Students will be engaged in problem solving, creative thinking, and collaboration through invention-based learning.


## Grandparents' Art Night
